LAST WEEK – March 30, 2018 – Tony Knobbe; Experiences aboard a Navy Aircraft Carrier

Fifty five attended on March 30, including Davenport Rotarian, Bill Burress. Other guests were Beverly Smith and Teri Thavenet. Kelly Meyer asked for members to volunteer at the Special Olympics on Saturday, April 7. Dennis Peterson asked for members to consider attending “The Toast” that replaces the District Conference and will be held at the Steeplegate on April 12. Presently we have 25 members/spouses representing North Scott.

John Maxwell will be inducted into the Hall of Honor at Davenport West High School. He says that is quite an honor (and a surprise). Jeff Ashcraft asked for members who are interested in serving on the Rotary Board to contact him. He doesn't really want to chase people down. Ryan Varner briefly told about the Mud Run Committee and the work they are doing. Bill Tubbs was the sergeant and collected \$78 in his quiz about trees.

Tony Knobbe is passionate about his recent visit to a Navy Aircraft Carrier. He says the smells are incredible. Mostly the constant smell of jet fuel. He witnessed numerous planes practice landing and landing on the deck of the huge 8 story ship. Fifty or sixty planes were housed on this ship. Every space had a plane, ammunition, supplies, etc. Not much open space. There are no elevators, just a lot of steps to move from one story to the next.

The planes go from zero to 175 miles per hour in a matter of minutes. They are Hornets and Super Hornets. Most planes are about 28 years old. They are old and tired. The young mechanics are constantly checking the planes over for cracks or other problems.

Tony's mission is to educate the local community about the Navy and to encourage graduates to consider it as a career.
