### **Foundation Minute for Week of August 27**

In Vancouver, British Columbia there exists a Police Tactical Training Center a state-of-the-art facility complete with firing range, simulation rooms, gymnasium, and classrooms. A Rotary Peace Fellow named Bryan Nykon, has put his police experience and his education as a Rotary Peace Fellow to work in this facility. He trains police members to de-escalate unpredictable situations and to use words in place of force, when possible, to control confrontations.

Bryan's duties include teaching high-yield, low-risk judo combined with the tactical police judo, focusing on control tactics best suited to street-level policing and self-defense. The approach incorporates empty-handed control and defensive tactics like arm-grabbing or using pressure points.

The highest risk of violence generally occurs during an arrest. Bryan teaches his students that risk can be avoided by something as simple as altering your arm grip. One grip gives the person enough room to swing around with a kick, while another can prevent that from happening. Everyone's safer when a fight is avoided. Law enforcement agencies have policies that guide the use of force, describing an escalating series of actions to resolve a situation. Police officers are instructed to respond with a level of force appropriate to the situation. The policies acknowledge that the officer may have to move from one part of the continuum to another in a matter of seconds. This is a key area where Bryan's training at the Rotary Peace Center influences how he instructs recruits and experienced police officers.

The use of words, or when necessary open hand control, can reduce the need for a baton or Taser-like device, thus avoiding interactions that can intensify into prolonged confrontations with a community lasting weeks.

Byran has learned at the Rotary Peace Center, that critical listening is the most important lesson which he uses now in training police officers. "Police officers need to listen to find out what is happening, how they can help, and who is responsible before applying any kind of force, whenever possible ... "You need to really listen to understand what the person is saying. Do they understand what is happening, is there a language barrier, drugs, or a cognitive challenge?"

It is rewarding to see a Rotary Peace Fellow applying their skills, experience, and training to reduce the need for the use of force in the community. Your contribution to The Rotary Foundation enables this to happen. Thank you.

LAST MEETING – August 24, 2018 – Marty O’Boyle and James Martin: What’s going on in Eldridge.

Fifty members and guests attended the August 24 meeting at the Eldridge Community Center. Guests were Nancy Case and Rotarian Ken Beck from Davenport Rotary. The meal was catered by North Scott Foods. Vice President, Jeremy Kaiser presided over the meeting, in the absence of Jeff Ashcraft.

Pat DeLuca gave a touching recap of the August 18 Mississippi Mudder event. He stated that Ryan Varner was a person of action. He had a vision of the Mud Race; he put his vision into action, set goals and got it done! Pat enjoyed being the “Man with the Microphone”. He also enjoyed all the muddy hugs he received at the finish line. Several shirts were left over and will be for sale at a meeting soon for \$5.00 each.

Tom Messer encouraged members to sign up for the golf outing at Glynn’s Creek on September 14. The meal will be catered by Smoking Butts. Pat Olsen gave an update on the “Rallies for Youth” Auction. He stated that we have less than 90 days to pull it all together. Carolyn Scheibe gave \$20 to the education fund for the birth of her 6<sup>th</sup> grandchild, Margo Kate Scheibe. Joe Stutting said the grand opening of the new and improved auditorium will be October 1. A speaker about Internet Safety will speak that evening.

Mayor Marty O’Boyle and Assistant City Director James Martin gave a recap of what is going on in Eldridge. Next summer the feed store will be gone and the silver bullet will be moved, so that turn lanes can be added at LeCLAire Road and First Street. The story about the growth in Eldridge made the front page of the Quad City Times and Cedar Rapids newspaper. That is a BIG deal!

Eldridge has had a flat property tax rate since 2000. In 2017 the city grew 12.5 per cent. The expansion of the walking trail, south on the Railroad right away will begin in October. A possible site for a YMCA with a pool would be the Petersen Enterprises 3.4 acre site. This project requires a lot of cash and takes a long time to get passed and built. Plans for a Y are still uncertain.
