Walter (Walt) Craig Bredbeck,

91, longtime resident of Davenport and Le Claire Iowa, passed away peacefully at Fountain West in Des Moines, Iowa, Monday August 20, 2018 where he had been residing since 2012.

Walt was surrounded by his family at his time of passing.

A celebration of life service will be held at 1:00 PM, Friday, September 28 at St. Paul Lutheran Church, 2136 Brady St, Davenport, IA 52803 Followed by a luncheon at the church.

Walter Craig Bredbeck was born and delivered by his grandfather (Dr. William Berry a Pediatrician) on September 17, 1926 in Omaha, Nebraska to Walter Benjamin and Frances Marie (Berry) Bredbeck. He graduated from Benson High School in 1944 and from Iowa State University in 1950 in Electrical Engineering. But, not before registering for the draft and entering the Navy to serve in WWII in the South Pacific.

Walter then returned to Iowa State U to finish his degree. Upon graduation went on to work as an Industrial Engineer for Iowa Illinois Gas & Electric and moved to Davenport, IA for his entire professional career of 41 years. Walter finally retired in 1992. Upon moving to the Quad Cities for his job, he met his sweetheart and on January 5, 1952, he married Leone Mable Porth. Who shared his love of dancing, theater, travel and adventure. Travel they did to five continents! Many great family camping trips, white water canoe trips, hiking, wilderness backpacking and scuba diving. Walter was an Excellent Award winning Photographer and has left us a treasure trove of great photos and was well known for his slide shows! He loved to play golf, was active in the Boy Scouts as a Scout Master, Davenport Swim Team President, Rotary International, and Blackhawk Hiking club. He loved running The Bix 7 well into his 80's and also loved making up and telling his own jokes. Walt also enjoyed playing bridge, crossword puzzles and reading. He could have a conversation with you on almost any subject or current event. LAST WEEK – SEPTEMBER 7, 2018 – PDG CHRIS KNAPP; D6000 FOUNDATION CHAIR

Sixty seven members and guests attended the Friday meeting to learn more about the Rotary Foundation, where our money goes and what it is used for. TRF is 101 years old and was started in Atlanta, GA in 1917. Over all, it has given away 3 billion dollars. There are 3 funds to direct money to: the annual fund, the polio fund and the endowment fund. You can also leave money to Rotary in your estate planning.

The fight to rid the world of polio is ongoing. Pakistan and Afghanistan are the countries that are still affected by this disease. Bill Gates has given several million dollars as a Rotary match to fight polio. Funds from TRF come back to the clubs that apply for Community Grants through D6000. The number of Rotarians is down, so if members don't give more, the yearly intake will become less.

In the 535 Rotary districts in the world, D6000 ranks in the top 1 per cent for giving.

Guests attending on Friday were Rotarians Duncan Cameron from Naples, FL, Aaron Christopher and Theresa Mangieri from Davenport Rotary. Also Jim Runzer, guest of Charlie Jones, Chuck Collins, guest of Bill Tubbs and Rosie Carlyle, guest of Lorraine Lynch.
