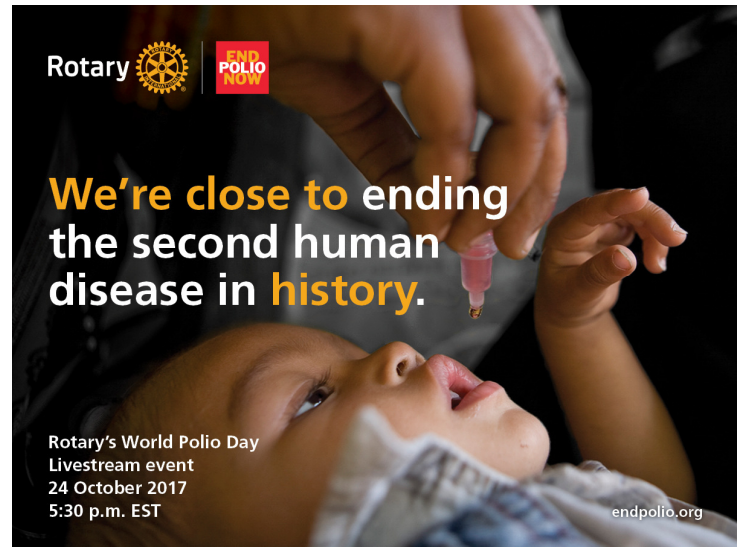

LAST WEEK

LAST WEEK – SEPTEMBER 28, 2018 – John Maxwell; Agriculture, Genomics, County Supervisor

Sixty seven attended on Friday including visiting Rotarians, Duncan Cameron from Naples, FL and Ken Beck from Davenport Rotary Club. Other guests were Greg Lundgren, guest of Rich Horst and North Scott Service Club students Abby McKay and Elsa Treiber.

Tony Knobbe presented the club with a Rotary Exchange Flag from Italy. He was honored to attend a Rotary meeting and receive attention from people speaking Italian. Pat Olsen asked for members to bring in auction items the month of October. After the October 5 meeting, members will canvas the community for gift cards and assorted items for the auction. John Maxwell auctioned off two pies made (at the last minute) by Joan. Chris Connolly and Duncan Cameron bought them for a total of \$210. John was the sergeant and raised \$11. (Dr. Brad was the sergeant last week and raised \$80.)

John Maxwell was the speaker and gave members a lot of facts about his Robotic Dairy, farming operation, time on the school board and his race for a position on the Scott County Supervisor Board. His brother, Dr. Edwin Maxwell has become a master cheese maker. The cheese curds are sold locally at the I-80 truck stop and at the Maxwell Country Store. They won first and second place awards at the Iowa State Fair.

John and Joan Maxwell give many tours to visiting groups. About 7000 come per year, with 2000 of those being from foreign countries. Of the many acres they farm, about one third of the crop will feed their own livestock. They have over 300 bushels per acre on their corn production plot. The 2018 yield was 336 bushels per acre.

One of the things John is extremely proud of from his time on the school board is the increase in the FFA program and the hope of building a regional FFA center for all of Scott County to use. Also the student built home project is supported totally by North Scott Students.
