Director of Communications & External Relations Iowa Soybean Association

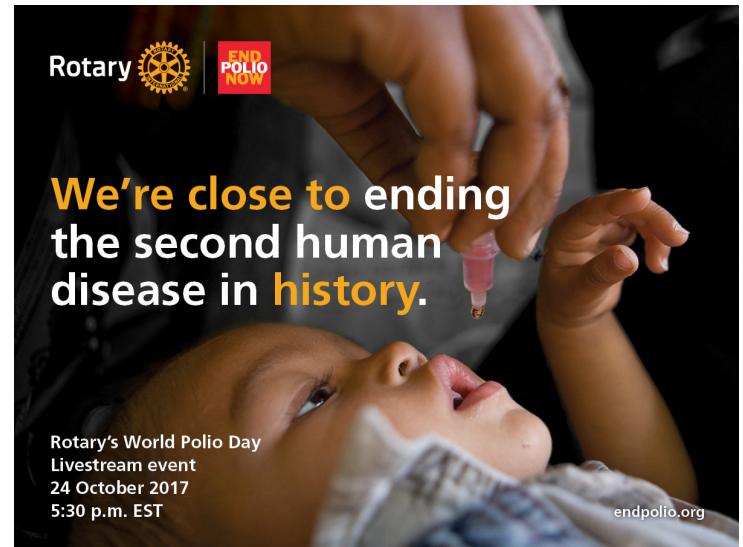
