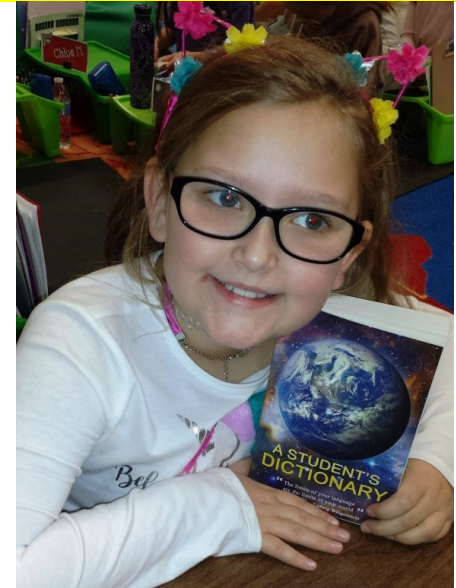

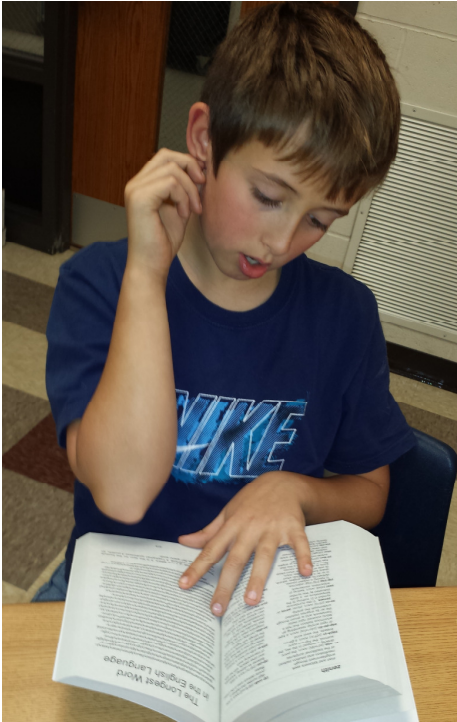
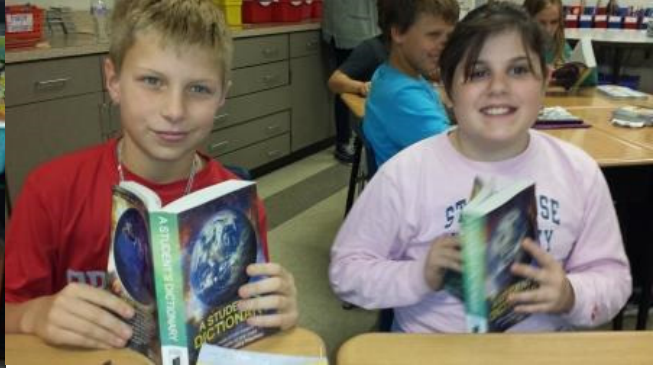

## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What time does the event start?

5:30 PM the doors will open. (The bar will also open at 5:30)

### 2. What time is dinner?

Dinner will be served at 7:00PM

### 3. What time does the auction start?

The Silent Auction will start at 5:30. Tables will begin closing at 6:45. The silent auction will end at 7:30. The live auction will start immediately following the program.

### 4. What is the dress attire?

Typically, business casual is the attire.

### 5. Will there be assigned seating?

YES. We are limited at the number of people we can fit in the room and will assign tables for everyone. It is important that you sit at the assigned table to avoid moving other people around the night of the event. If you wish to sit with someone, please indicate at least one week prior to the event. Tables are set up for 10 seats per table.

### 6. Are there meal options available due to dietary restrictions?

Yes. Please indicate the dietary restriction one week prior to the event so we can ensure you or your guest has the appropriate meal the night of the event.

### 7. I cannot attend the event; can I still participate in the silent auction and/or donate to the event?

Yes! This year you may register for the silent auction or donate to the event without being there! To register, visit: <http://northscottrotary.home.qtego.net/>

### 8. How do I check out?

Prior to receiving your Silent or Live auction items, you must check out through the QTEGO page. Checking out is as easy as clicking a button. When you register, you will be asked to provide a credit card to check out. You may elect to pay with cash or check at time of checkout. There will be check out stations at the entrance of the ballroom to help you with that process. New this year, you must check out prior to receiving your items. A receipt will be generated on your phone. Once that happens, show your receipt to the silent auction committee and they will retrieve your items for you.

### 9. I didn't win any auction items; can I still donate?

YES! There is a "donate" button on the QTEGO site.

### 10. Do we still use bid paddles for the auction?

No, this year your bid number is your phone number you register with. All Live auction bidding will recorder by a QTEGO staff member and our Live Auction Callers.

All auction items will be listed on the website and will be easily accessed from your mobile device or computer. This should make the silent auction process easy, entertaining and fun!

What if you didn't win an item but want to donate? With the simple click of a button, your donation will be received! Can't make the event but want to participate? No problem, we can register you as a guest and you can bid on silent auction items or make donations right from your mobile device. Tired of waiting in line to look at all the items? We have you covered. All of the items will be listed on the site and you can peruse them from your table or next to the bar! Tired of losing a silent auction item at the last minute? No worries, QTEGO allows you to set a bid maximum on items that will automatically outbid someone until you reach your maximum bid! Somebody out bid you? You will receive an alert telling you to check your item. Live auction bid paddles, remembering your bid number, missing something to make sure you are still in the lead, not anymore! Your bid number is your phone number! Checking out with QTEGO is easy too because you check out on your phone! We are very excited about this new feature!

We have received some questions regarding mobile devices. What if you are not a fan of using your mobile device? No problem! QTEGO will send a dedicated team to our event to help make sure you can bid on the items you want.

LAST WEEK – November 2, 2018 – Mary Beth and Lindsey with Genesis Pediatric Therapy Unit

Mary Beth and Lindsey are SO passionate and proud of the work they do with children that need some “extra” help in numerous areas. They service children in the entire QC area, some even drive an hour for their services. Their unit employs 30 therapists. They started out with only 6 therapists. Some of the services they offer are family follow-ups with NICU babies, children on the autism spectrum, youth that have had concussions, eating disorders, speech therapy and many other problems.

They also have two therapists that are dance teachers and lead a “chance to dance” therapy. They strongly recommend no screen time, not even television, for children under 2 years old. They also have a cage full of bungee cords. There is no need for hands on the patient from the therapist. Children as well as stroke patients use it.

Sixty attended on Friday. Guests included Marina Snopova, guest of Katelyn Darling and Annulka Shipp, guest of Marcia Brandt. Jim Smith was the sergeant and collected \$61 in fines.
