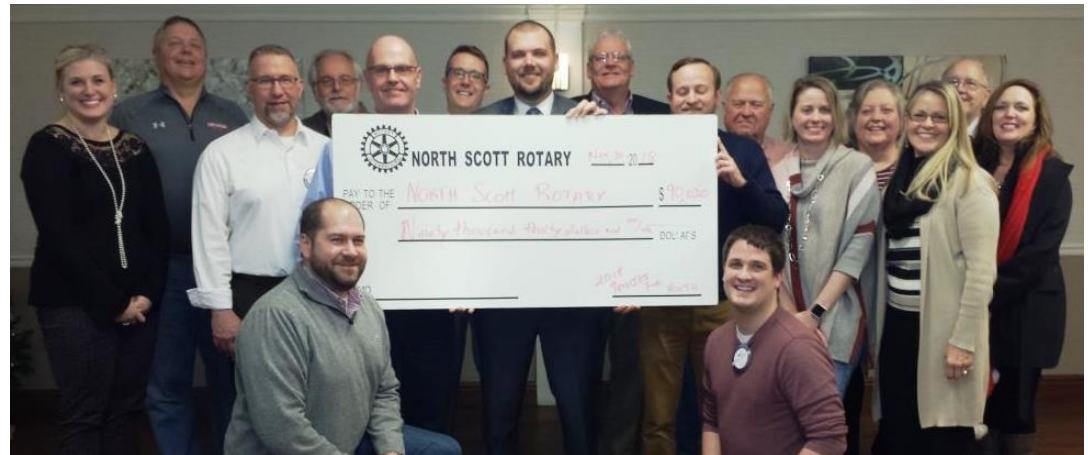

Seventy attended on Friday, including these guests. Mark Carlson from Moline Rotary, Brian Williams from Illinois Quad City Rotary and Megan Pedersen from Bettendorf Rotary. Additional guests were Megan Olsen, guest of Pat Olsen, Jason Happel, guest of Scott Case, and Jim Holt, guest of Brad Burt.

Thank you notes were distributed from Ed White fourth graders for the dictionaries they received. Paul Holzworth gave \$80 for his 80th birthday and Jeff Ashcraft gave \$20 for his son, Jordan's recent engagement. Brad Burt was the sergeant and collected \$77 in fines.

Pat Olsen gave details from another very successful auction. (See front page). The goal of \$90,000 net income was met after an additional \$400 was donated on Friday. Thanks to all!!

Abbi Strobbe, pre school teacher at Neil Armstrong Elementary in Park View, presented the club with details of the Inspiration Garden that will be completed Spring 2019 for use of her 3 and 4-year-old students and will also be available to the whole Park View area. It will be a fenced in, safe place to play with cement around the outer edge for bicycle and tricycle riding. The center area will include benches for reading books, a nature area, sand and water play, climbing equipment, a garden area and many other things. It must include 10 specific areas to be certified. She is working with a representative from St. Ambrose to complete the areas. The funds for this project were the Impact Grant of \$15,000 awarded from the 2017 auction revenue. Greg Schaapveld has surveyed the area and determined the location for the Garden. There will be a "work weekend" when ground prep is complete and warm weather arrives.
