Mark Mathews is the Executive Director of the Child Abuse Council, a regional non-profit organization serving the Quad-Cities and surrounding area. For over 40 years, the Council has led community efforts to eliminate child abuse and neglect by strengthening children and families through prevention, education and treatment. Headquartered in Moline, IL., the Council has 28 employees, a \$2 million dollar budget and serves over 5,000 children and parents each year.

Mathews is proud to have a "head for business", but a "heart for the children and families" in our community. Mathews graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Criminology from Northern Illi-

nois University and has a Master's degree in Counseling from Western Illinois University. In 1995, Mathews began his career as a police officer and is a graduate of the Colorado Institute of Law Enforcement Training. Mathews moved to the Quad Cities in 2000 and started a Real Estate Development and Management company called "The REDMan Group". Along with his duties at the Council, he remains CEO of that business which serves 30 tenants in 7 rental properties throughout Rock Island, IL. Mathews was born and raised in the Chicago area and still maintains a love for the Cubs and Bears. He is married and has 2 sons who all share his passion for sports and travel.

LAST WEEK - March 15, 2019 - Mike Hasselbusch: Dream Center of Peoria (DCP)

Fifty-four attended on Friday, including Moline Rotarians Mark Carlson and Alan Anderson. Also attending were Dick Cole's guests, Shirley Cole and Theresa White.

Dr. Brad Burt presided over the business meeting in Jeff's absence. Kelly Meyer asked members to sign up to volunteer at the Special Olympics on Saturday, April 13. Josie Seymour reminded members of the membership committee meeting, held right after the regular meeting. Pat Olsen reminded us about the March 22 grant deadline and Warren Hodge proposed a challenge to form a diverse team for the Mud Run in August. Josie was the sergeant and collected \$61 in fines.

Mike Hasselbusch of DCP is extremely passionate about the homeless and underprivileged children and families that he and many other volunteers serve in downtown Peoria. He is an engineer at Caterpillar by day and a volunteer at DCP in the evenings and Saturdays. DCP is a vocational technology program to help young boys and girls develop an interest in something that might help them get a job one day. Mike teaches motorcycle repair. He gets many donated machines which the kids strip down, and he teaches them to repair as needed. Some have been wrecked, some just do not run correctly.

Other programs are also taught. Auto repair, 3D printing and simple electrical wiring are some areas available. They also have a homeless shelter that holds 100 women and children. They have 24 apartments to help get families out of homelessness that the family units must apply for and follow some strict requirements. When Mike retires from Cat, he will work with the kid's full time. They also pack 2000 back packs per year for children to have a couple good meals on the weekends.
