It has done the same in Belize, Guatemala, Honduras, India, and Kenya. Since 2013 the Foundation has invested in more than 1000 such programs in more than 100 countries.

LAST WEEK - March 22, 2019 - Mark Mathews; The Child Abuse Council

Sixty-four attended on Friday including Austin Messer, guest of Tom Messer and Sara Somsky, guest of Rev. Rich Pokora. Jeff Ashcraft mentioned that the grant deadlines were today (March 22). He also encouraged members to sign up to help with the trike build on Saturday, May 4. Kelly Meyer also asked for helpers for the Special Olympics on Saturday, April 13. John Maxwell was the sergeant and collected \$20 in fines.

Mark Mathews, Executive Director of the Child Abuse Council was the speaker on Friday. He has a head for business, but a heart for the children and families in the community. He began his career as a police officer. He moved to the Quad Cities in 2000 and started a Real Estate Development, which he still manages along with the Child Abuse Council job.

100 per cent of child abuse is preventable. Kids deserve to be loved, healthy and happy. There were 20 school buses of abused/neglected children in Scott and Rock Island County in 2017. Types of abuse are physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse and neglect or denial of critical care. If someone tells you they are abused, believe them.

Children that are abused usually leads to adult problems, such as smoking, drug abuse, multiple sexual partners, etc. There are many programs and services available through the Child Abuse Council.
