George Ryan, I-74 Corridor Manager, Building a Bridge for the Future: I-74 Mississippi River Bridge Project

The I-74 Mississippi River Bridge project is part of a regional strategy to improve the I-74 corridor and access across the Mississippi River in the Quad Cities. George Ryan, I-74 Corridor Manager with Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions, will discuss the planning and construction of this important bi-state project.

Professional background:

George Ryan is the Corridor Manager for the \$1.2 billion construction of the new river bridges and reconstruction of Interstate 74 in Bettendorf, Iowa and Moline, Illinois. Prior to joining Wood Environment and Infrastructure Solutions, he performed multiple roles for the Illinois Department of Transportation during a 34-year career. His expertise includes facilitating communication and cooperation in the design, construction, and maintenance areas while achieving and \$500 million reconstruction of Interstate 74 through downtown Peoria, Illinois. preserving the best highway system possible within available resources. He has been involved minary design, design and construction of numerous major projects. One such example was overseeing all phases of the largest down state roadway reconstruction ever undertaken in Illinois, the \$500 million reconstruction of Interstate 74 through downtown Peoria, Illinois.
