CONGRESSMAN DAVE LOEBSACK

A lot has changed since Congressman Dave Loebsack last spoke at North Scott Rotary in April 2017. The congressman, who is not seeking re-election, has agreed to return this Friday for one last time to give us his insights on the nation's issues.

U.S. Rep. Loebsack (D-Iowa City) grew up in Sioux City, where he attended East High School. After graduation, he attended Iowa State University, where he earned bachelor of science and master of science degrees. He went on to earn a doctor of philosophy degree from the University of California, Davis. In 1982, he moved back to Iowa and became a teacher at Cornell College in Mt. Vernon. Today, Dave has the honor to serve as a Professor Emeritus at Cornell.

Dave is currently serving his seventh term in the U.S. House of Representatives. In 2015, he began serving on the House Energy and Commerce Committee, which is the oldest standing committee in the House. It has jurisdiction over a wide range of issues, including: energy policy; healthcare policy; trade policy; telecommunications and the internet; environment and air quality; and consumer affairs and protection. Previously, he served as a member of the House Committee on Education and the Workforce and the House Armed Services Committee.

He is also a member of: Center Aisle Caucus; the Congressional Caucus to Fight and Control Methamphetamine; the Congressional Rural Caucus; the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues; the Congressional Military Families Caucus; the House Manufacturing Caucus; and the Congressional Missing and Exploited Children's Caucus, among others.

Dave and his wife Terry, a retired school teacher after 35 years, are parents of four grown children and are also the proud grandparents of three grandchildren.
