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

Chuck Long has been synonymous with University of Iowa football for more than thirty years. As a former player and coach, his combination of charm, charisma and winning attitude has motivated many young athletes and influenced multitudes of fans throughout the Midwest and beyond.

Born in Norman, Oklahoma and raised in Wheaton, Illinois, Chuck attended Wheaton North High School and played football, basketball and baseball. He led his team to the 1979 state football title as the starting quarterback and was named to the all-state championship squad. He also gathered all-state honors in 1980.

Chuck starred at quarterback for Coach Hayden Fry and the Iowa Hawkeyes from 1981-85. For his career, he threw for 10,461 yards, the first Big Ten player and second player in college football history to

throw for more than 10,000 yards, played in five bowl games and holds nearly every Hawkeyes passing record. During his final season in '85, he led the Hawks to the Rose Bowl and finished second to Bo Jackson in the Heisman race. He was named Big Ten Player of the Year, received the Davey O'Brien Award (nation's best quarterback) and Maxwell Award (college player of the year) and was named a first team Consensus All-American.

Selected by Detroit as the 12th overall pick in the 1986 NFL draft, Chuck played eight years of professional ball – seven with the Lions and one with the Los Angeles Rams.

He began his coaching career in 1995 at his alma mater, first as the defensive backs coach and then quarterbacks and special teams. Chuck's sixteen-year coaching career included positions with the country's other top college football programs including the University of Oklahoma

2000 national champions, San Diego State University, and the University of Kansas. One of Chuck's proudest accomplishments was as offensive coordinator for Oklahoma in 2003, the year Sooner QB Jason White won the Heisman Trophy.

Chuck was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999 and is an inaugural member of the Kinnick Stadium Wall of Honor. He transitioned out of coaching in 2013 and is currently the CEO/Executive Director of the Iowa Sports Foundation and an analyst for the Big Ten Network. In 2017, he and Aaron Putze co-authored "Destined for Greatness – the Story of Chuck Long and Resurgence of Iowa Hawkeyes Football" available now at Amazon.com and various retailers.

Jan. 9, 2019 – Hawkeyes Great Chuck Long will share stories of his football life and career and sign copies of his just-released biography *Destined for Greatness* during a special noon meeting of the North Scott Rotary Club.

Long, who played quarterback for the Iowa Hawkeyes from 1981-85 and holds numerous school, Big-Ten and national passing records, will autograph and personalize copies of *Destined for Greatness*, greet and join in photos with guests and share memories of playing for Hawkeyes football coaches Hayden Fry and Kirk Ferentz.

The event will begin at noon with Chuck Long's program beginning at 12:30 p.m. He'll sign books and join in with photos immediately following the presentation. Hardbound and softbound copies of Destined for Greatness will be available for \$30 and \$20 respectively (personalized copies make a great gift!).

Destined for Greatness, authored by Aaron Putze of Waukee, tells the story of Long's remarkable career and the 1980s resurgence of the University of Iowa Football program. The one-of-a-kind journey is an inspiring one—from starring on the neighborhood playground as a youth growing up in Wheaton, Illinois (affectionately named "The Tot Lot") to his current role as CEO & Executive Director of the Iowa Sports Foundation.

The fast-paced narrative recounts the highs and lows of the Iowa football program's struggle to reclaim national relevancy while Iowans endured the pain of the 1980s farm crisis. It also retraces the path from starring in Kinnick to the challenges Chuck faced in competing in the NFL, including his first start under the lights on a Monday night contest versus the defending Super Bowl Champion Chicago Bears.

Destined for Greatness includes personal accounts from coaches Fry and Kirk Ferentz, Iowa teammates Hap Peterson, Jonathan Hayes and Mark Vlasic, John Campbell (former KCRG-TV Sports Director), Marc Hansen (former *Des Moines Register* columnist) and former Iowa Gov. Terry Branstad.

Long holds the University of Iowa's marks for yards passing, completions, touchdown passes and total offense (game, season and career) and pass attempts in a season and career. He is *still*, more than three decades after his college career ended, the most accurate passer in Big Ten History (.649).
