Mike Miller is the President & CEO of River Bend Foodbank in the Quad Cities, serving 23 counties in eastern lowa and western Illinois. He has been in food banking since 2008, as the COO of Gleaners Food Bank of Indiana and Vice President of Operations of the Greater Cleveland Food Bank prior to assuming his current role in 2015. Mike also serves on the Network Council of Feeding America, the na-



tional network of food banks, chairs the Emergency Food Systems Work Group of the Illinois Commission to End Hunger, is the Chair of the Iowa Food Bank Association, Secretary of Feeding Illinois, and has previously served on the boards of Feeding Indiana's Hungry and the Quad Cities Student Hunger Drive and Food Rescue Partnership.

Mike's background is engineering and business, with degrees in computer and electrical engineering and an MBA from Purdue University. He worked 15 years in manufacturing in the pharmaceutical, wire and cable, and food industries, then served as a church administrator prior to becoming a food banker.

#### **River Bend Foodbank**

River Bend Foodbank is the largest hunger-relief organization in the Quad Cities and surrounding communities, having distributed over 15 million meals in 2018 to hungry people in eastern Iowa and western Illinois. Its mission is to lead the community-wide effort to end hunger in eastern Iowa and western Illinois. They do this through food distribution in partnership with 300 agencies as well as through Mobile

Food Pantries, Senior Pantries, School Pantries, and their Backpack Program. The best and easiest way to help is to go online at <u>riverbendfoodbank.org</u>.

I'm quite pleased that River Bend Foodbank has accepted and will be part of the presentation. We partner and complement each other quite well.

The Food Rescue Partnership is a Quad Cities coalition that promotes rescuing food for its best possible use. We work to achieve this mission by providing education and awareness to the community, partnering with local professional food establishments & restaurants and agencies related to hunger relief and waste reduction, and advocating for the EPA Food Rescue Challenge which informs the FRP Vision for a Quad Cities Community dedicated to eliminating food waste.

Merle Anderson tells us from Arizona; My Uganda Friend is Visiting the USA

Below is part of a note from our friend, George Ntibarikure, Country Director for CRS in Uganda. He is also Robbinah's closest adviser. He visited us about 5 or 6 years ago after he was on a business trip to Washington, D.C. Maybe you will recall me telling you the story of George staying at our home. The afternoon he arrived, I took him to the Hy-Vee Store. Then, I brought him home, showed him his bedroom and bathroom. He took a shower before dinner, which Mary Lou had prepared for us.

I asked George what he wanted to drink. His first choice was a glass of water. I put ice into a glass and went to the tap and filled the glass. His eyes were as big as saucers. Then, it dawned on me why he was alarmed. So, I drank the glass full of water. I assured him it is safe to drink water from the tap. He said he would never tell his children that he drank water from a tap because they would try it at home and they would become sick.

He told them about going through a car wash and seeing me use a remote garage door opener. He told them about riding in a tractor, on a combine, on a fertilizer applicator, giving a program at Rotary and his many adventures. But, he never told them that you can drink water from a tap in America.

George is in North Carolina for a few days. He and dozens of other Country Directors from all over the world are attending a USAID Conference. Here is a paragraph from an E-mail he sent to me today. Thought you might find it interesting. (And it is an example of things we just take for granted. We are fortunate to live in America) -- Merle

Hope all is well in Tucson. I think many people are still not informed about your water system. My colleague from Ethiopia didn't believe me until we asked an American about drinking water from the tap. When I told him to join me, he told me that he worries falling sick outside home. The following morning he testified that he drunk from the tap last night when he got thirsty and that he was waiting for his final call from God. I told him he will not receive the call until may be he reached his country home. I told him this is America!
