


Dr. Dennis Marchiori Chancellor Palmer College of Chiropractic

Dennis Marchiori (mar-KEE-ohr-ee), D.C., Ph.D., became chancellor of Palmer College of Chiropractic in December 2009. He graduated with his doctor of chiropractic degree from Palmer College in 1990, and went on to earn his M.S. degree in anatomy at Palmer in 1992. In 1995, he completed a three-year residency in radiology at Palmer College leading to diplomate status with the American Chiropractic Board of Radiology. Dr. Marchiori received his doctorate in policy, planning and leadership from the University of Iowa in 2005. He has had faculty appointments at Palmer College in the Research, and Diagnosis and Radiology departments. His administrative tenure at Palmer includes the roles of department chair, dean, vice president of academic affairs for the Davenport campus, and vice chancellor for academics for the College system. In addition to his teaching and administrative service, he has published numerous scientific articles and three editions of a comprehensive textbook in radiology, titled "Clinical Imaging with Skeletal, Chest and Abdomen Differentials." He also serves as chair of the Association of Chiropractic Colleges.



LAST WEEK - April 12, 2019 - Dr. Wendy Wintersteen; President of Iowa State University

Sixty-four attended on Friday, including Rotarians Doug Peterson, Iowa QC Rotary, Al Tubbs, Maquoketa Rotary, Maria Osterberg, Bettendorf Rotary and Ellen Bluth, Davenport Rotary. Other guests were Linda Tubbs, Brent Puck, Connie Connolly, Shawn and Josie Meyer, Annette Tank and Ken Klindt.

Upcoming events mentioned were Special Olympics on April 13, Trike Build on May 4 and next weeks meeting at Palmer College of Chiropractic. President Jeff announced the outcome of the Community needs grants awarded. A total of \$35, 366 was awarded to 26 deserving organizations. Dr. Brad Burt was the sergeant and raised \$61 in fines. John Maxwell also donated \$36 to the education fund for the sale of twelve dozen eggs from Cinnamon Ridge Farms.

Dr. Wendy Wintersteen, President of Iowa State University was introduced by her long-time friend, Becky Bray. She is the first female president of ISU and only the second President that is a graduate of ISU. She was a wealth of useful and interesting knowledge. ISU graduated its first class 150 years ago in March. It was also one of the first colleges to admit women. She spends a lot of time managing the budget to be more efficient. Tuition will go up 3 per cent (or more) every year. She is proud to say that 40 per cent of ISU grads leave college with no debt.

Just a few things that were invented or patented by Iowa State students are: the fax machine, lead free solder to use in making stain glass windows, craft butter, a heating/cooling unit to serve certain craft beers at the correct temperature and engineer in-a-box. Textiles is a huge area of study and recently a student won a \$35,000 scholarship in New Your City for her display of young men's wear.
