## Iowa NICE founder Angela Boelens

Just over a year ago, on Feb. 24, 2022, the world awakened to Russian troops invading Ukraine. Our speaker on Friday was moved to action. Angela Boelens lives in DeWitt and teaches at Augustana College. She is the founder of IA NICE (Iowa Newcomer Integration & Exchange), a non-profit agency supporting Ukrainian refugee families seeking humanitarian parole through the Uniting for Ukraine program with resettlement and integration into local Iowa communities.

IA NICE (a 501c3 ) also provides community members and sponsors guidance and necessary resources to help and support newcomer families as they rebuild their lives in Iowa.

As of Sept. 30, over 7.5 million Ukrainian people had been forced to flee their homes since the Russian invasion. On April 21, the United States announced the Uniting for Ukraine program which provides a pathway to safety for Ukrainian citizens and their immediate family members, allowing them to seek refuge in the United States with the help of a sponsor, for a two-year period. With the theme, "Together, we can create a path-

way toward healing and belonging," IA NICE serves the following ways:

# 'We want to tell our collective history'

**Drew Wilson** introduced **Ryan Saddler** who told about the MLK Center in Davenport. Thanks to **Jan Touney** for speaker notes:

## By Jan Touney

By the end of the summer, what has been a vacant lot at 5th and Brady streets in Davenport will be transformed into MLK Park, fulfilling a long-time dream of many to have a public memorial to the slain civil rights leader.

Ryan Saddler, CEO of Friends of MLK, updated North Scott Rotarians on the project during a presentation on Friday, March 3.

Saddler, who is associate vice president, Student Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Office, at St. Ambrose University, shared a story and video of Linsey Pitts, who served in the First Iowa Colored Infantry during the Civil War and became a successful businessman after the war, operating a saloon at 120 E. Fifth St. in Davenport. Other Black-owned businesses were in the area as well at the time. He also related the story of Jake Busey, the first African American to graduate from Central High School, and how his widowed mother brought her family of nine children to Davenport.

“Our focus with MLK Park is not just to tell Black history, but to tell our collective history,” he said. “I’m a proponent of the premise that Black history is our history. It’s our shared history. Unfortunately, it has been overlooked, and unfortunately, it has not been preserved as much as it should have been.”

Planned for the park, which is adjacent to the MLK Interpretive Center, are interchangeable panels that tell the stories of Davenport’s racial and cultural history. They will be changed frequently so visitors to the park will have different experiences each time they visit.

“There’s so much rich history that crosses cultures and faiths,” he said. “My vision is to find a way to tell these stories in a collective way, in an impactful way.”

Construction on the \$1.3 million project is expected to begin in the spring and be completed late this summer. Funding has come from numerous sources, including the City of Davenport, Scott County, State of Iowa, Ascentra Credit Union and Ascentra Credit Union Foundation, and others.

While Saddler said the construction costs are covered for the project, he indicated that additional funding could be used toward programming at the site. The Friends of MLK sponsors the upcoming Juneteenth Festival as well as programming on MLK Day in January. The group also does training on racial healing and trauma, and has helped in collections of hygiene and cleaning items that go into Blessing Boxes. The collected items have filled a classroom at the former Lincoln School in Davenport, he said.

“We want the park to have a sense of newness, of information-sharing that is free and available to the public,” he said.

# IA NICE supports Ukrainian refugees

sponsor Ukrainian Families in need, helping through the matching process and connecting families, obtaining government approval to serve as a sponsor, and educates sponsors and their newcomers with resettlement and integration activities once they arrive.

**Financial Support:** Our program provides financial support to newcomers, primarily in the areas of temporary housing and living expenses, during the first few months of resettlement while newcomers obtain work authorizations, steady employment, public benefits, and housing.

**Community Network:** IA NICE collaborates with local individuals and organizations to create a welcoming, warm and supportive community where newcomer families feel safe, appreciated and celebrated for their courage and independence as they strive to make Iowa their new home. We also work to connect families with local agencies and resources to support their resettlement.

**Employment Connections:** We work to network and collaborate with local businesses to identify employment matches with newcomers and assist local businesses with required HR filings necessary to hire legal immigrants.

**Educational Opportunities:** IA NICE works closely with local schools and administrators to plan for the arrival and education of school-aged children arriving with English as a second language with the goal of providing high quality educational opportunities.
