After a few rough seasons due to the Covid 19 pandemic, things are returning to normal at one of the Quad-Cities' treasures – the Circa '21 Dinner Playhouse in Rock Island.

Kimberly Calhoun, who works in design and marketing for Circa '21, updated North Scott Rotarians on what's happening with the popular dinner theatre venue during a presentation on Friday, March 17.

"I am so pleased to be here. I love talking about Circa '21, and I love being a Rotarian," said Calhoun, a member of the Rock Island Rotary Club.

Circa '21 owner and producer Dennis Hitchcock purchased the Fort Armstrong Theatre in 1976 with plans to turn it into a dinner theatre. He had attended a dinner theatre in Minneapolis and saw how people enjoyed it.

Its opening production was "I Do, I Do" in 1977.

"The concept of dinner theatre was unique to the Quad Cities at the time," she said.

Since then, 300 productions including comedies, dramas, musicals, mysteries, children's shows and celebrity appearances have drawn audiences to Circa '21, the only professional theatre in the Quad Cities. The Lettermen have appeared for 36 consecutive years, and will be performing at the theatre for matinee and evening shows on May 15. The current mainstage production at Circa is "Grumpy Old Men, The Musical."

Calhoun characterized the period of Covid restrictions, which began when Illinois Gov. JB Pritzker closed all indoor dining on March 16, 2020, as "really rough." The 334-seat venue was closed for a total of 10 months, and reopened

at less than 50-percent capacity, seating about 120 per show.

Community support for the theatre as it navigated the restrictions was strong, she said.

And with sold-out shows in late 2022 for “Beauty and the Beast” and “White Christmas,” things are returning to normal, she said.

“We have unbelievable community support,” she said. Circa '21 is one of only two dinner theatres in the country with a performing wait staff, The Bootleggers.

“We are so proud of the Bootleggers,” she said. Troupe members are servers, do a free show, and then change into costumes for the main show.

Calhoun, who was an editor and page designer at the *Dispatch-Argus* before joining Circa '21, talked about how enjoyable her job is.

“I love spending the day at my desk, listening to the Bootleggers rehearse, listening to the audience applaud during a matinee, and hearing music and laughter surround me,” she said.

The new season, which begins with the Christmas show, will be announced in June. Information about all Circa '21 productions and special events can be found at the website www.circa21.com.

Footnotes: Tom Walljasper, who has appeared in 106 shows at Circa, was a student of Paul Holzworth. Paul worked with Circa musical director, Ron May. Kyle Defauw, who played the Beast in “Beauty and the Beast” and had the lead in “White Christmas,” is a friend of Scott Case’s granddaughter, Peyton Reese, and performed on stage with Bill Tubbs in Countryside Community Theatre’s “The Music Man.” Circa '21 is the oldest theater in the U.S. with its original owner. Thirty percent of business comes from motor coaches.

POLIO PLUS

Six months and no new wild polio virus cases!

The March 17 polio report marked six months with zero children afflicted from the wild polio virus. Three years with no new cases are required before the world can be declared polio-free. When completed, thanks to Rotary's partnership with the World Health Organization, Unicef and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control, polio will be just the second disease eradicated in human history (Small pox was the other). The campaign was begun by Rotary in 1987 when 350,000 children worldwide were afflicted annually. Today, Pakistan and Afghanistan are the only countries remaining where the wild polio virus has not been eradicated. This week's report:



"We are now 26 weeks since the most recent reported Wild Polio Case – on 9/15/22 in Pakistan: **What is that Polio Picture?** Confidence in surveillance essential for certifying a polio-free world. Latest recommendations from independent global certification body. The Global Commission for the Certification of Poliomyelitis Eradication (GCC) met recently in Amman, Jordan, to review progress towards interrupting wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) transmission in polio-endemic Pakistan and Afghanistan, implementation of the Global Surveillance Action Plan, and to hear from the six regional certification commissions on current regional priorities and issues. 'It will be the quality of poliovirus surveillance that will allow the GCC to certify the eradication of WPV1 with the highest possible level of confidence,' said Professor David Salisbury, GCC Chair."
