Stephanie Eckhardt said her daughter beat her dad, **Sean**, in golf at Glynn's Creek.

Sara Somsky and **Deanna Jensen-Valliere** reflected on attending **Bill** and **Linda Tubbs'** Arch Klumph Society induction last Saturday at Rotary World Headquarters in Evanston. "I needed more Kleenex," said **Sara**. "It was very emotional. There are so many fantastic Rotarians!" **Sara** said she "freaked out over the engineering equipment" in Room 711, which is the re-creation of the office where the first Rotary meeting was held in 1905 (photo on page 6.) **Deanna** said it was "very inspirational" and "pretty spectacular" to see **Bill** and **Linda's** induction. She added that it was good to get to know her fellow Rotarian, **Sara**, better.

Rotary Quiz: Bill Tubbs said only **Rob White** was able to name the three venues of North Scott Rotary in its first almost-50 years:

1. **Holden's Edgetowner at Mt. Joy**, from Oct. 13, 1973 through Jan. 16, 1981;
2. **Davenport Holiday Inn on North Brady**, recently torn down: from Jan. 23, 1981 through March 1, 1985.
3. **Best Western Steeplegate Inn**, March 8, 1985 to the present.

Sergeant-at-arms John Maxwell raised \$15 in fun fines, including those not parking within the lines, **Kim Wilkens** for the length of his guest introduction, and anyone who was NOT for the Iowa Hawkeye women who played in the national championship game.

Rotarian Mahesh Sharma, county administrator, introduced Rotarian county treasurer and former county supervisor **Tony Knobbe**, whose topic was, "Understanding your tax bill." "It's been one of my best experiences working

with Tony," he said. "We always work through our issues."

The assessor's job is to make sure your property is classified correctly, Tony said, explaining why a doctor in Bettendorf has failed multiple times to get his five-acre residence with a goat and a tractor classified as agricultural. "The assessor values according to the market." Scott County treasurer Tom McManus tracked 1,200 sales last year and his assessments are 99 percent accurate. (The state allow 5 percent leeway.)

Importantly, properties are taxed not on assessed values but "taxable" values after state rollbacks are applied. Actual taxes cannot go up more than 3 percent in a year. Tony said reporters Mark Ridolfi in *The North Scott Press* and Sarah Watson in the *Quad-City Times* explained this well, but *The Des Moines Register* did not. Besides the rollbacks, there are three pages of tax credits you can apply for.

The next step, is the county auditor's office calculating the total levy by taxing districts. This is based on budgets set by city councils, school boards and county supervisors. "A large percent is personnel" who provide services expected by citizens. Cities, schools and the county account for 97 percent of your tax bill. The remaining 3 percent go to city and county assessors, ag extension, fire districts, townships and bangs (livestock disease control).

In the recently announced assessments, residential properties went up an average of 20 percent. The inflation is "not crazy," Tony said after the federal government put \$7 trillion in the economy in reponse to Covid.

The state calculates the rollbacks. Residential and ag taxable values cannot exceed 3 percent. Ninety percent of commercial assessed valuations are taxable.

The process is complicated and takes four years.

Pat Olsen said more effort should be made to explain all of this. **Tony** said today is his fifth presentation like this this week. "Who showed up at (budget hearings) (of cities, schools and the county)?"

Dr. Brad Burt queried why the assessment of Aqua Tech Car Wash on Elmore in Davenport went from \$1.7 to \$3.0 million. Nearby, Mills Chevrolet increased \$7 million. Tony said there is a process where they can be challenged.

Rich Golinghorst said ag land went up 30 percent. Tony expressed frustratin that he has been unable to get anyone at the state to give him the formula upon which that is based.
