Sara McLaughlin-Cross from the First Tee – Quad Cities was our speaker on April 28th. First Tee – Quad Cities is a youth development nonprofit whose mission is to impact the lives of young people by providing educational programs that build character, instill life-enhancing values, and promote healthy choices through the game of golf.

About three fourths of the Rotarians in the room raised their hands with knowledge of the First Tee - Quad Cities. Besides teaching about honesty, integrity and making good decisions they like to teach about their mission of strengthening what you do in everyday life for 6- to 16-year-olds.

There are four sites currently: Highland Springs in Rock Island, Red Hawk and Emies in Davenport, and Iron Tees is coming in Bettendorf in May 2024. First Tee has many community sponsors like Martin Luther King Center, Big Brother Big Sisters, Spring Forward, and several

churches. They are curriculum based and focus on skills with their peers for 6 – 9 year old, 10 – 11 year old, 12 -13 year old, and 14-plus students.

Last year Emies had 161 students who took the class with the goal of 220 this year. Red Hawk had 408 students with the goal of 450 this year and has a new classroom that was built called the Jim Hasley Center. Highland Springs in Rock Island had 220 students and a goal of 325 in 2023. They also have a new clubhouse and learning center at Highland Springs. Sara said they hate waiting lists and try to get as many as they can into their programs. St. Ambrose Men's and Women's Golf Teams mentor these students as well.

First Tee Quad Cities sponsors the PGA Jr. Teams at the Davenport Country Club, Crow Valley, Glynn's Creek and Short Hills. They also sponsor the JD Classic Youth Day with clinics breakfast, goodie bags and bus students in with 1,000 coming! They want to help cover the financial aspect of all the programs to help get someone to Augusta!

Sara then shared a video of their programs and events involved with the First Tee - Quad Cities and it was great to hear about this program and have her present to us.

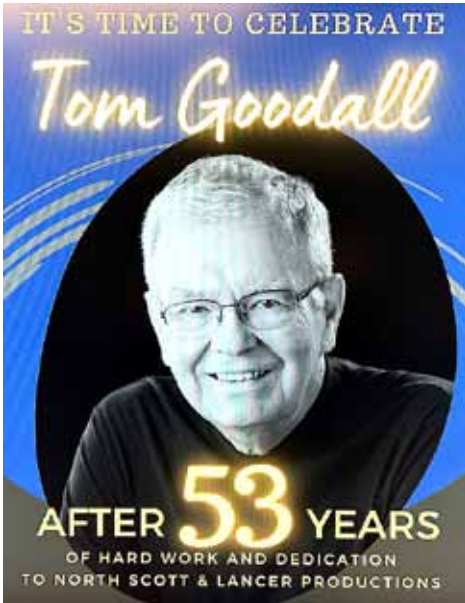

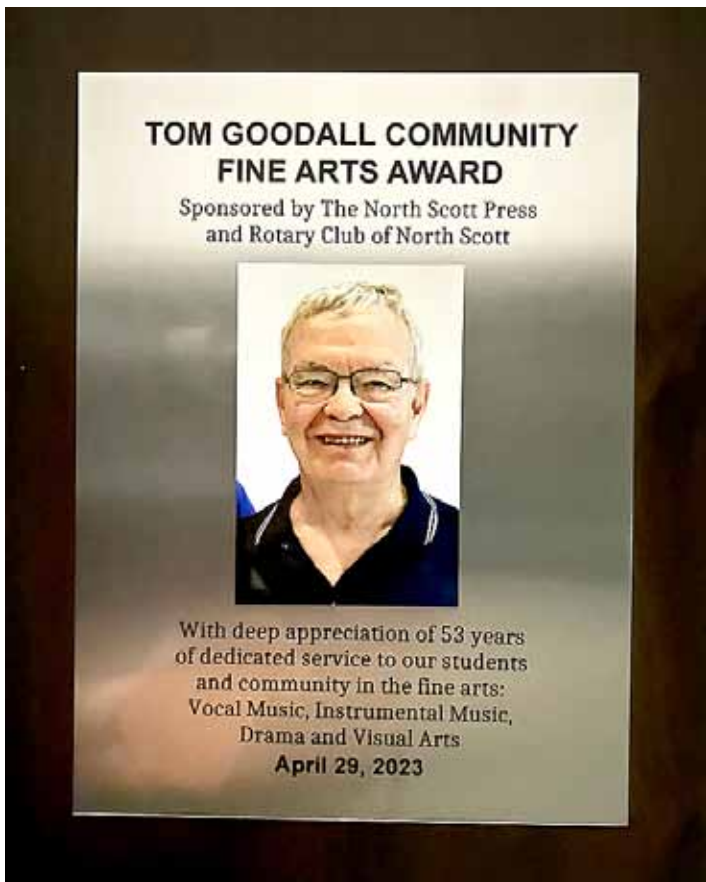
