Rotary Foundation chair **Chris Connolly**, who shared information about programs of The Rotary Foundation, using a PowerPoint created by District 6000 Foundation chair **Norlan Hinke**.

Rotary founder Paul Harris was an 1896 graduate of the University of Iowa Law School. From The Rotary Foundation's beginning in 1917, \$4 billion has been invested in humanitarian projects in the seven Areas of Focus (see above).

Because of its low administrative costs, efficiency and effectiveness of programs, The Rotary Foundation has been among the top five of 5,000 charities evaluated by Charity Navigator for many years. Gifts to the Annual Programs Fund (APF) are invested three years with the earnings in those years funding operations. After three years, half is made available to districts (District Designated Fund) and half goes to the World Fund to match and support projects.

APF is where most donations go, but Rotarians may also give to the Endowed Fund, where your money is invested in perpetuity, to PolioPlus, which is Rotary's No. 1 world-wide goal of eradicating polio, or can be designated for specific projects.

Part of DDF can be earmarked for community projects, which District 6000 does. North Scott Rotary has applied for, and received, community grants up to \$5,000 for projects like this year's S.A.V.E., last year's Rotary Adventures, the Rotary Inspiration Play Zone, and others.

Chris said North Scott Rotary members' giving which were on a spreadsheet provided by Pat Olsen enabled him to tell members how much was needed to achieve the next \$1,000 giving level with the 50/50 club match. As a result, 31 members either became Paul Harris Fellows, or moved to the next recognition level. *Congratulations, all!*

The July 8 Moonlight Chase water stop location is changed to 302 S. 8th St., Eldridge.

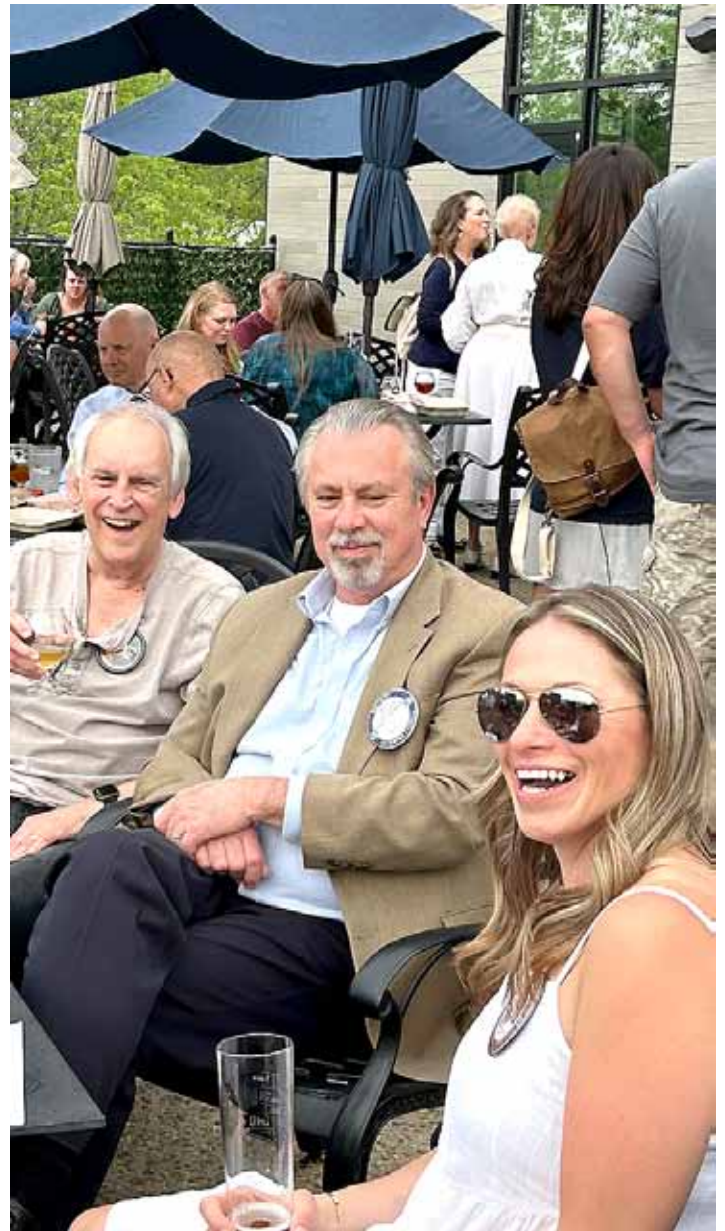

Allyson Schulz is working towards her associate's degree in science. Her mom is a pediatric/NICU nurse, so growing up seeing an extremely educated woman doing a wonderful science-filled job inspired her. Health issues caused her to miss half of her sixth-grade year. In her sophomore year of high school, she had a major surgery, but thanks to being homeschooled, was still able to graduate on time. Her illness and time in the hospital turned her away from medical science, but she has always been intrigued by true crime and the science behind investigations, so is

considering **forensic science** as a career and would take great pride in bringing closure to those who don't know what happened to their loved ones, or justice to those wrongly accused. She says her puzzle-solving skills and determination would greatly help. She is set to graduate from SCC at the end of the fall 2023 semester. After Scott, she would like to attend a four-year university and receive a doctorate in one of the forensic fields. To become a forensic scientist is her ultimate dream.

ABOUT OUR SCHOLARSHIPS

Rotary Club of North Scott scholarships

Our first scholarships of \$1,000 are in memory of **Keith Mattke** who was a Rotarian for over 40 years. Keith proudly served our country in the Marine Corps during the Korean War. Following his discharge, he graduated from Iowa State University, where he earned his degree in education, and later, his master's degree. He was a talented carpenter, crafting many wonderful projects. He began his industrial arts teaching career at Davenport High School and transitioned to Davenport West when they opened their doors. He also served as the administrator of vocational education for the entire school district, and helped start the Vocational Center. He was proud that this Center helped students find avenues to career paths they otherwise wouldn't have had.

This year's recipients of the Keith Mattke scholarships are: **Dylan Bergmann, Cora O'Neill** and **Carley Schoenthaler**.

Dorothy White began a life-long love affair with the piano at the age of 3 and, with her siblings, entertained the neighborhood from the family porch. She then progressed to playing background music in the silent movies, with the scene cues for the movies' moods and tempos standing her in good stead with her playing over the years. After retiring from running the office of her veterinarian husband, Dr. J. B. White, she embarked on yet another career, as a pianist at Von Maur in NorthPark Mall. When customers walked through the doors, they could "just tell" it was Dorothy at the piano. Dressed in coordinating outfits with matching bows in her snow white hair (she was dressed "bow to toe"), Dorothy would be a feature there for 18 years, retiring reluctantly at the young age of 97. She continued to play on Fridays here at North Scott Rotary from 1985 through her 98th birthday and was a recipient of the Paul Harris Fellowship.
