“Of our military force, 40 percent is in the Guard and Reserve,” Keating said. Those service members must balance their military service and civilian employment.

“The training needs for the Guard and Reserve are the same as for full-time military folks,” she said. “It takes a lot of support from both families and employers.”

After B.J. Keating retired from the military in 2021, April said, the transition was hard on her “because I strongly identified as a military spouse, and I felt that was being taken away from me. I still wanted to be a part of the military community.”

ESGR gave her that chance.

“I learned about ESGR and their need for volunteers, so I signed up,” she said.

The area that the Keatings are co-chairs of encompasses Jones, Jackson, Cedar, Clinton, Scott and Muscatine counties.

There is a federal law – USERRA (Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Right Act) -- that protects military service members and veterans from employment discrimination on the basis of their service, and allows them to regain their civilian jobs following a period of uniformed service.

The volunteers with ESGR speak with employers about the laws that outline the rights and responsibilities for service members and their employers.

“Sometimes there’s confusion; there’s miscommunication,” Keating said. “Our ombudsman will step in to help mitigate those situations.”

Employers are sometimes taken to a unit where their employees are training.

“They get to fly to a training location and see what their military employees do,” she said.

Service members and their families can nominate employers for a succession of awards. The highest recognition is the Freedom Award, handed out by the Secretary of Defense annually to up to 15 employers per year. Last year, Keating said, the Storm Lake (Iowa) Police Department was one of the recipients.

Keating said ESGR is always looking for volunteers, and

they do not have to have any kind of military affiliation.

“We’re looking to connect with employers so we can educate and inform,” she said.
