Rich Horst introduced **Dave Herrell** and **Jane Kranovich** of Visit Quad Cities. Thanks, **Jan Touney**, for program notes:

Tourism matters. Dave Herrell, president and CEO of Visit Quad Cities, brought that point home to North Scott Rotarians on Friday, July 14.

"Certainly, from our point of view, I think probably that tourism is a little marginalized as it relates to economic development, but I'll tell you that tourism is probably the most important thing in economic development because it's that first impression," Herrell said, "getting them (tourists) to fall in love with that place we call home."

Herrell was accompanied by Joan Kranovich, the new vice president of business growth for Visit QC and director of Sports QC, who spoke of the many efforts in place to welcome thousands of visitors to the area over the next few weeks for RAGBRAI. The final day of RAGBRAI, on July 29, when participants will finish the ride by dipping their tires into the Mississippi River, coincides with the running of the Quad-City Times Bix 7. The confluence of the two events is being called BIXBRAI.

Herrell, who took the job in 2018, said the Quad Cities "feels more like home every day, and it's because of the people."

"We've got people who care about each other and want to do the things that hopefully create value, and share stories and talk about how wonderful this place is to live, work and play," he said.

Visit Quad Cities is a "lean and mean organization," he pointed out, supported by a staff of 10, a 17-member board of directors and "hundreds and hundreds of volunteers who are connected to our organization to hopefully create the outcomes and do the kinds of things we want to do."

He spent a few minutes talking about the recent announcement of a new American Airlines flight out of Quad Cities International Airport to Charlotte, N.C. Bookings are already being taken for the twice-daily flights that will begin Dec. 20. "That announcement is a great catalyst for us on how we want to position the Quad Cities moving forward," Herrell said.

Charlotte is one of the Top 5 international hubs in the country. "That means we are globally connected," he said.

Key to the success of the new air service is getting support from the community to use it. "You can build things, but unless every day you're selling them, you're marketing them, advertising them and promoting them 365 days out of the year, you do not move the needle at all. It just doesn't happen," he said. "You've got to have a lot of partnerships and collaborations behind the scenes to make this happen."

"It's about all of us, the business community, the public sector, driving and creating demand in the market."

He also spoke about the opportunities for the area from the large cruise ships that make their way down the Mississippi and stop in Davenport.

"The people on those vessels are really compelling to us because you never know who they're going to be," he said. Perhaps it's someone whose child is looking for a college, somebody "looking to buy our buildings," or someone thinking about relocating a business, he said.

Before turning the microphone over to Kranovich, Herrell said that "data points are suggesting that we're kind of coming out of the pandemic."

Tourists and business travelers help boost the tax base. It's not just about staying in hotels," he said. "It's hotels, restaurants, it's small business retail, it's transportation,

it's gaming revenue. It's every piece of revenue you can shake a stick at."

Kranovich talked about the thousands of RAGBRAI cyclists who will be making their way to Davenport, many of whom will park in the Quad Cities on Friday, board a bus to head to western Iowa and return on the last day. "We are the first impression for a lot of RAGBRAI riders," she said.

"We have 1,500 people just coming from Coralville (the Friday night stop) to Davenport," she said.

The ending point at the Marquette Street landing will be painted in gold, in line with the theme of "Be Bold, Ride Gold." Vendors, music, even therapy dogs will be there to greet the cyclists.

"There will be a lot of fun and a lot of things happening," she said, including closing ceremonies around 2 p.m., a first. More information can be found at www.davenport-ragbrai.com.
