RECIPE



Lemon posset

Sara Somsky writes: I had quite a few Rotarians ask for the recipe for the lemon dessert I brought to the corn boil. I've given it to several, but if you'd like to include the below in the next newsletter, feel free. I got the recipe off the internet (no recipe author known).

- Lemon Posset
- 6 to 8 lemons
- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 1 cup sugar
- ½ cup lemon juice (can adjust to taste)

Slice the lemon in half (long ways). Remove inside of lemon, maintaining the integrity of the lemon peel. Inside portion of lemon could be juiced.

In a pot, combine heavy whipping cream and sugar.

Warm mixture on stove until bubbles appear – use low to medium heat.

Remove from heat, then stir in lemon juice.

Pour lemon mixture into the empty lemon “shells”. (Can use a muffin pan to keep shells from rolling around.)

Chill for 3 hours or overnight.

Can add a garnish (e.g. basil, mint, berries) as desired.

ROTARY PRINCIPLES

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Rotary Code of Conduct

As a Rotarian, I will:

1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behavior and activities.
2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve Rotary.
3. Conduct all my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example for others.
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings.
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talent to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

The Four-Way Test (of the things we Think, Say or Do)

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?
