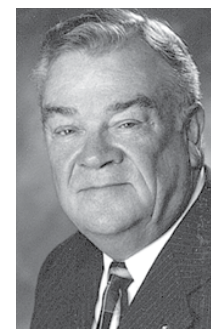

Whimsical stuffed animals graced the tables at the North Scott Rotary meeting of Friday, Sept. 8.

Brought there by District 6000 District Governor Dennis Drager, the "stuffedies" represent an important initiative for District 6000. Comprising the "Zoo of Love," the animals are a fundraiser for Rotary's PolioPlus program. The animals cost \$40, with \$30 of it going directly to PolioPlus.

It was one of several programs Dennis announced to the North Scott membership for the year he is district governor.

In a presentation mixed with humorous banter about the Sept. 9 Iowa-Iowa State football game, the tone became serious when Dennis spoke of issues that are important to him and his wife, Heidi, and that he hopes Rotary clubs in District 6000 will embrace.

Among them are:

- **Transforming mental illness to mental wellness** one life at a time. One of the initiatives of Rotary International President Gordon R. McNally is removing the stigma surrounding mental illness. To that end, a Rotary Action Group has been formed in District 6000 to organize awareness of mental health initiatives in the district. "We hope we can be impactful throughout the district," he said.
- **Assisting in programs to aid the homeless.** Mental health plays a big part in many instances where people end up without shelter, he said. Statistics show that suicide among the homeless is nine times higher than among the population with sustainable shelter. "Our ask is that you get involved with an organization that helps with homelessness in your community."
- **Donating blood.** "We want to see how much blood can be donated related to this club," he said. Hosting a blood drive was one suggestion he gave.
- **Donating clothes for those in need.** "Clean your closets out; take your things you no longer need and give them

to an organization that can use them,” he said, citing DAV (Disabled American Veterans) as an organization he and his wife support because of its assistance to veterans.

• **Donate to an effort to help fill a crate of wheelchairs for Ukraine.** One wheelchair costs \$200, and a container of wheelchairs (280) costs \$56,000. The Rotary Foundation will match half of the costs, so the district needs to raise \$28,000. Checks can be mailed to District 6000 HEF, P.O. Box 5774, Coralville, IA 52241.

District 6000 clubs are being encouraged to increase their role of service. “Find your passion,” the governor said.

He also announced several upcoming events for District 6000 members. On Oct. 17, a Rotary Foundation social will be at **Crawford Brew Works** in Bettendorf. The 5:30-7 p.m. event will include a short program.

A **District Celebration** will be held on April 20, 2024, at the **Pella Opera House**, and he encouraged Rotarians to attend. District 6000 also will be sponsoring a **Four-Way Test Speech Contest** for high schoolers. The final contest will occur at the District Celebration.

Dennis encouraged Rotarians to **like the district’s Facebook page**. Its former page was inexplicably taken down several months ago, along with the pages of thousands of other Rotary clubs. You can find the new page at Rotary District 6000 Iowa.

He ended his presentation with a gift for North Scott Rotary president Tracy Lindaman.

“It’s my firm belief that all organizations are built upon a good foundation,” he said. “The club’s foundation is the president of the club. And in order to support the club’s foundation, I’m gifting a pair of Rotary socks to your president.”

And with that, he presented a smiling President Tracy with a pair of multicolored Rotary socks.
