The Quad City Storm hockey team is looking forward to an exciting year both on the ice and in the community outreach it is planning, club President Brian Rothenberger told North Scott Rotarians on Friday, Oct. 6.

"It is hockey season," Rothenberger enthusiastically announced to club members.

While he predicted the team has the potential to have its best season since first established in 2018, he said the team is constantly trying to engage non-traditional hockey fans as well through its game-day promotions and community engagement.

Coming up first is opening night on Saturday, Oct. 21 featuring a pre-show concert by Grammy-nominated country artist Eric Paslay. The concert, to take place at 4 p.m. in the parking lot of Vibrant Arena in Moline, is free with the purchase of an opening night ticket. The Storm face cross-state rivals the Peoria Rivermen that night, and "our enforcers and their enforcers always seem to get the best of each other," Rothenberger said.

A Day of the Dead promotion is planned for Oct. 27. The team will auction off special jerseys to be worn that day, with proceeds to benefit Mercado on Fifth, the popular street market featured on Friday nights in Moline. Mercado vendors will be serving food on the concourse.

The team is planning the first-ever Hockey is for Her night on Saturday, Oct. 28. Olympic Gold Medalist Hilary Knight will be there to meet fans and sign autographs before the game. Rothenberger, who called Knight "the best female hockey player in the world," said the team is sponsoring a Women in Sports business panel that day from 5 to 5:40 p.m.

Other upcoming promotions are Trick or Treat Day (Oct. 29) and Salute to Military (Nov. 11). The day before the Nov. 11 game, the public will have an opportunity to go to the arena and paint the names of active service members or veterans on the ice in red or blue paint. A similar promotion, Hockey Fights Cancer, is scheduled for Feb. 9.

A Feb. 1 Education Day game scheduled in the morning is expected to draw some 8,000 students, he said, noting he would welcome volunteers from Rotary to help with the event.

"It's the best field trip ever," he said.

A complete list of promotions and ticket information can be found at the Storm website, [www.quadcitystorm.com](http://www.quadcitystorm.com). Rothenberger said the Storm has donated more than half a million dollars back to local non-profits during its five years.

In answer to a question about attendance at games, he said crowd size rebounded after Covid. Last season's average attendance was 3,100, and the team is projecting that to increase to 3,400 this year. There are about 500 season ticket holders, about half of whom are 50 or older.

"We have created a very entertaining, family-friendly fun" experience, he said.

## ROTARY PRINCIPLES

### *The Object of Rotary*

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- FIRST:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- SECOND:** High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- THIRD:** The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;
- FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

### *Rotary Code of Conduct*

**As a Rotarian, I will:**

1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behavior and activities.
2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve Rotary.
3. Conduct all my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example for others.
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings.
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talent to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?
