Film production in Quad Cities

THANKS to Rich Horst for arranging this week's program. **J. Douglas Miller** was born, raised and educated in the Quad Cities region of eastern Iowa. He began his career as an usher at the RKO Orpheum Theatre in Davenport. Doug then entered the United States Army and among other duties served as an administrative assistant to the Adjutant General of Support Command Headquarters in Qui Nhon, Vietnam, and as a production coordinator for the Bob Hope Christmas Show while assigned to the Commanding General of Support Command Headquarters in Da Nang, Vietnam. Upon his honorable discharge he continued his education at the Palmer Colleges in Davenport.

Doug worked as a production assistant at the WOC Broadcasting Company in Davenport, which was an NBC affiliate, as well as being the first radio home of President Ronald Reagan. He eventually became a producer and the director of community relations at WOC. Doug was promoted to director for corporate development of WOC's parent company, Palmer Communications, Inc. in Des Moines. He co-founded a multimedia company which acquired the WOC-AM and KIIK-FM properties from Palmer Communications and he created one of the first audio-video digital production companies in the Midwest, known as Signal Hill Productions.

Mr. Miller has served in various production capacities for such clients as the Iowa Film Office, Illinois Film Office, Quad City Film Coalition, Shell Oil, ADM, Union Pacific, I-Wireless, John Deere, QVC, ABC, Disney, VH1, RAI, FilmAuro, Medusa, State of Illinois, Library of Congress and the White House. Doug was the production director for Duea Film which produced nine motion pictures

Tom Goodall: 'Arts are well and living'

Oct. 27, 2023: On a day when weather turned from warm to cold, 64 Rotarians and guests came together for fellowship at the Steeplegate Inn with a program about five years of community theatre by longtime North Scott artistic director and theater manager Tom Goodall. President **Tracy Lindaman** presided. Piano music was by **Marguerite Holzworth** with **Paul Holzworth** leading singing of "America the Beautiful," "Welcome Song" and "R-O-T-A-R-Y." **Drew Wilson** shared a reflection about "National Civics Day," including the preamble to the U.S. Constitution. **Deanna Jensen-Valliere** introduced Visiting Rotarians and guests: speaker **Tom Goodall** and **Joanne, Nancy Case** (guest of **Scott Case**), **Bonnie Powell** (guest of **Steve Powell**), **Linda Tubbs** (honorary member), pianist **Marguerite Holzworth**, **Shasha Grunwald** (age 3), and **Carrie Keppy** (guest of **John Maxwell**). Joining by Zoom was **Steve Suiter**.

Announcements:

President Tracy reviewed feedback from the Club Assembly, which had been emailed to members. It showed strong support for a big project for the club's 50th anniversary, that it be labeled North Scott Rotary, and involve hands-on participation, but not at the exclusion of other community needs. Possible locations included Sheridan Meadows Park in Eldridge, Scott County Park, Lost Grove Lake, and North Scott Vocational Center. She invited members to speak on behalf projects. **Bill Tubbs** said every suggestion has merit and we can and will support projects throughout the region. He lifted up the vision of a **North Scott Rotary Community Band Shell**, near the **North Scott Rotary Inspiration Play Zone**. It seems to "check all the boxes" as a legacy gift which could be achieved with both cash and hands-on participation, and not at the exclusion of other needs. It is in the city's vision and will be used a lot. **Marcia Brandt** said keep our minds open to projects outside Eldridge. **Riley Grunwald** spoke in favor of a permanent project, as did **Scott Case**. **Jill Grunwald** suggested an ongoing project collecting school supplies. **Rita Rawson** said many things can be done in addition to a big project.

Program: In the interest of time, **Scott Case** gave an abbreviated introduction of longtime North Scott and Quad Cities theater and artistic director **Tom Goodall**.

Though his name is attached to many awards and accolades from a storied career in theatre and the arts, the namesake of the "**Tom Goodall Community Fine Arts Awards**" spent a good deal of time thanking and praising others during a presentation to North Scott Rotary on Friday, Oct. 27.

"I wanted to stop and thank you for being firm supporters of the arts at North Scott," said Tom, a legend in the North Scott community. "Every year, you present the Fine Arts Awards, with *The North Scott Press*, and it is so appreciated."

Before talking about the craft of set design, which he began doing as a student at Maquoketa High School, he recognized several North Scott Rotarians, including Paul Holzworth ("He's Mr. Theatre in Davenport") and Jeff Ashcraft ("one of the best directors ever").

"It isn't just me, it's the community around me that makes this work," he said.

An astute speech teacher who observed Tom doodling during class at Maquoketa High School, asked if the young man would be interested in designing a set for the school production.

"He gave me a script, and for the next two years, I designed sets," he said. "I really enjoyed it."

And the rest, as they say, is history.

A teacher for more than 50 years, Tom said he always enjoyed going to work. He began at North Scott High School when the building was new.

"I honestly never hated to go to work. I loved it."

Tom served as Artistic Director/Theatre Manager at North Scott and had been involved in more than 180 Lancer Productions shows when he retired.

He has done scenic design and technical directing for eight high school productions selected for the International Thespian Festival, and 11 for the Iowa Thespian Festival.

"I was really lucky to work with such wonderful students and kids," he said. "We had kids that did scenic design, lighting design, sound design that still do that. To this day, I have kids who do theatre all across the country. I am very proud of those kids."

He mentioned some of his favorite shows, both for Lancer Productions – "Ordinary People," "The Music Man," "Baby with the Bathwater," "Godspell," "Schoolhouse Rock" – and Countryside Community Theatre – "The Music Man," "The Sound of Music" and "A Chorus Line."

"I could go on and on," he said.

He told an interesting story about the first time "The Music Man" was done by Lancer Productions. He said he wanted a six-sided gazebo to be the focal point for the town, and asked the students to come in for a Saturday workday.

"I sort of challenged them to figure out how to build it," he said. "They got out their pencils and papers."

Seeing all the cars in the school parking lot on a Saturday, then-Superintendent Pat DeLuca stopped in. "He asked what the kids were doing," Tom said. "I said they're trying to design a gazebo, and I think they'll get it."

Pat asked the veteran set designer: "What happens if they don't quite figure it out?"

"I took him back to my office" and showed him the plans he had drawn for the gazebo. They (the students) did it the way they did it, and it worked beautifully," Tom said.

The superintendent's response: "I think they're learning!"

Tom said his career has been rewarding and enjoyable.

"I've loved all of it. And in conclusion, I'd like to tell you that the arts are alive and well and living at North Scott High School!"

In introducing Tom, Rotarian Scott Case recognized Tom's wife, JoAnn, as the "magnificent woman" behind the man. "For many nights, she was home alone because Tom was at the theatre doing what he does best."

Doug has worked for and or with many politicians, public figures, musical performers, entertainers and actors, a brief sampling of these include Presidents Reagan and Clinton; Senators Harkin, Grassley, Kennedy, Simon and Cranston; Congressmen Mezvinsky, Leach, Grandy, Evans and Braley and Governors Hughes, Branstad and Vilsack; as well as Mark Russell, Bruce Williams, Dick Clark, Sonny and Cher, The Beach Boys, The Yardbirds, Steely Dan, Rare Earth, Leon Russell, Billy Ray Cyrus, Jimmy Dean, Eddy Arnold, Liberace, Pearl Bailey, Ella Fitzgerald, Harry Belafonte, Burl Ives, Franco Nero, Brooke Shields, Anthony Quinn, Milton Berle, Arthur Fiedler and Cary Grant.

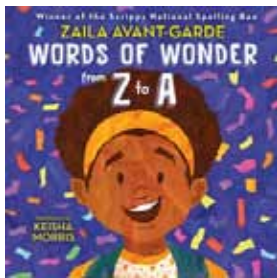

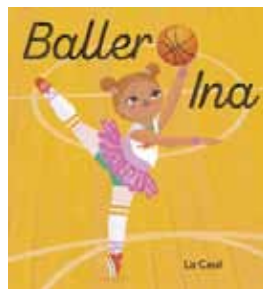
