Tony Knobbe introduced **Ellen Hosch**. Thanks to **Jan Touney** for program notes:

Knowledge is power when it comes to diabetes, North Scott Rotarians were advised on Friday, Dec. 8, during a presentation by Ellen Hosch, registered dietician and Certified Diabetes Care and Education Specialist at Genesis Medical Center.

Hosch gave an overview of what is diabetes and how to manage it. It's important, she said, that people know their numbers relative to blood sugar, A1C, blood pressure, triglycerides and "good" and "bad" cholesterol.

A fasting blood sugar number of 126 or above or an A1C over 6.5 are indicators of diabetes. But while 30 million people in the United States have diabetes, she said, 86 million people have prediabetes.

"Patients can have prediabetes for years," she said. "You could have elevated blood sugar and not feel bad." That's why it's so important that people "take ownership" before they start feeling bad.

Taking ownership involves making careful choices about what you eat, getting in enough physical activity (150 minutes a week is recommended), and being aware of the relevant medical numbers.

"You need to learn all you can about diabetes," she said. The American Diabetes Association website has a multitude of information that is easily accessible at www.diabetes.org.

"Mindless eating" is a problem in the United States, Hosch said. She gave practical advice that's easy to follow as far as healthy eating goes: The recipe for a healthy plate is to divide it into quarters. Fill two quarters with vegetables, one quarter with lean protein and one quarter with carbohydrates.

"Most of the diabetes day-to-day care is up to you," she said.

'Pay It Forward' for Empowering Abilities

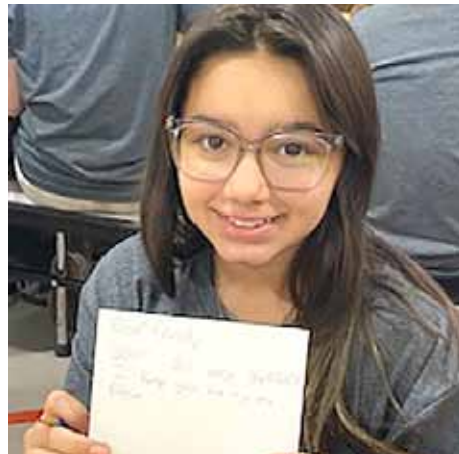
