# AG answers questions from Rotarians

**Deanna Jensen-Valliere** attended the Braking Traffik meeting yesterday, and February is "heart healthy" month.

**Tracy Lindaman** lifted up longtime NSHS social studies and American history teacher and coach, **Randy Denner**, who died Jan. 30. His Hall of Fame career influenced hundreds of students and he was an inspiration to the community.

**Sergeant-at-Arms Jim Smith** raised \$86 with fun fines including Eric Langan, for attendance, Greg Schaapveld, for making the paper, Tracy Lindaman, for being a new grandma, and if you haven't signed up for Special Olympics or the Valentine Party.

### Program

**Marcia Brandt** introduced Iowa Attorney General **Brenna Bird**, who has been on the job a little more than one year. The AG thanked her predecessor, **Tom Miller**, for a smooth transition, including letting her know there would be no desk in the office because it was his and he's taking it. But the chair stayed, and it was too big because he is tall!

Bird said being AG is her No. 3 role after wife and mother. The AG said proposing legislation to help people is important, and referenced a bill which would require mandatory minimum sentences for persons convicted of human trafficking. "They should spend serious time behind bars."

Bird joked about throwing out the first at a baseball game. "Home plate is a long ways away!" but observed that a big part of success is just showing up, which she did.

One hundred-fifty of the 250 employees in the AG's office are attorneys. They respond to criminal appeals, prosecute cases across Iowa, provide consumer protection and advise state agencies. They also help victims of abuse get back on their feet. "There are a lot of different tasks in

the office."

The AG's office files lawsuits on behalf of Iowans, as well, she said, referencing a recent suit against Tik Tok for not telling the truth about the age rating of its content.

The AG left time for questions:

Responding to a question from **Rich Pokora** concerning the removal of Donald Trump's name from primary ballots in Colorado and Maine because of charges of leading an insurrection on Jan. 6, 2021, AG Bird said she would not support that. "A basic premise of democracy is that people choose and not the courts. The 14th Amendment was never interpreted that way. Many states who did not support Donald Trump put his name on the ballot."

In response to a question from **Pat Olsen**, she said, "A lot of regulations are too much. I follow the laws and not my personal feelings. Bureaucracy making laws is a dangerous precedent."

**Tony Knobbe** queried about the Texas governor placing barriers in the Rio Grande River, which the federal government said they cannot do. "We side with Texas," said Bird. "(Persons) crossing include criminals, drug traffickers and human traffickers." She said in some places, the barriers reduced traffic by two thirds.

Rotarian and attorney **Jordan Williams** asked about the skill-based bar exam. Bird said she took it years ago but is not certain how relevant it is.

**Scott Case** asked a question about real estate mortgages. Bird said Iowans have sold title insurance when it is not needed. Iowa and Oklahoma and the only two states who do abstracts and titles.

**Drew Wilson** asked eminent domain in pipeline issues. The AG said that is all under the Iowa Utility Board.

The last question, from **Bill Tubbs**, was about the peculiarity that Iowa was the only state whose Justice Department brought charges against college athletes for online betting.
