Figge Art Museum Executive Director, CEO Michelle Hargrave

Thanks to Rita Rawson for arranging Friday's program. Michelle Hargrave has served as the executive director and CEO of the Figge Art Museum in Davenport since December 2019. She was previously the deputy director of the New Britain Museum of American Art, the first Museum devoted to American art, where she oversaw programming, development, marketing, and traveling exhibitions. Prior to that, she served as a curator and China Initiative Project director at the American Federation of Arts, where she worked with internationally renowned collections, institutions, and curators in North America, Europe, Asia and Australia to develop and implement traveling art exhibitions, and spearheaded AFA's US-China museum outreach. From 2002-11, as associate curator at the Bard Graduate Center in New York City, she worked on exhibitions such as William Kent: Designing Georgian Britain and Castellani and Italian Archaeological Jewelry. She has an M.A. from the Bard Graduate Center in the history of decorative arts, design, and culture and a B.A. from the University of Michigan. In addition, she is involved with a number of professional organizations, including the Association for Art Museum Curators and American Alliance of Museums, and serves on the boards of Visit Quad Cities, Downtown Davenport Partnership, and the Iowa Art Council.

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:
