Rev. Peter Pettit: Understanding the Israeli-Hamas war

Rotarians worldwide seek understanding of complex issues, and so it is with this week's speaker, Rev. Peter Pettit, who will share insights on the Israeli-Hamas war. This program, arranged by Bill Tubbs, comes highly recommended.

Peter A. Pettit is teaching pastor at St. Paul Lutheran Church, Davenport. He has worked in interfaith relations throughout his career as a pastor of the church and a scholar of Bible and Early Judaism (PhD, Claremont Graduate University, 1993).

He and his family lived in Jerusalem for a year, where they were active with the local Lutheran community and interacted with both Israelis and Palestinians.

Peter has written curriculum and led workshops, courses, and trips on Israel and Palestine, having been there about three dozen times. He has also written study and dialogue resources for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and published articles and book chapters on a variety of topics.

Prior to his call to St. Paul in Davenport in 2019, he was a parish pastor in southern California (1990-1999) and on the faculty of Muhlenberg College in Allentown PA, teaching religion studies and leading the Institute for Jewish-Christian Understanding (1999-2019).

Tapestry Farms: Reaching 100 refugee families

This year, Tapestry Farms is looking to help its 100th refugee family in the Quad Cities since the nonprofit organization was founded in 2017 by Executive Director Ann McGlynn.

McGlynn spoke to North Scott Rotarians on Friday, Feb. 23, about the organization's mission, what it does to welcome and support refugee families, and its growing urban farm system.

"We know, we see over and over again, that when families have just a little bit of help, a little bit of support, a little bit of guidance, a little bit of hope and a little bit of human connection, that they will take on the world," she said.

She cited the example of a family of seven – a mother and six children – whom St. Paul Lutheran Church in Davenport assisted in resettling in 2016, when McGlynn was employed by the church. The family, originally from the Democratic Republic of Congo, fled that country due to violence and lived in a refugee camp in Uganda before coming to the United States.

"They knew no English, the children had never been to school, and three of the kids had significant medical issues," she said. "And the father of the children had abandoned the family. As we started to work with them, we

spotted several gaps in our community for welcoming families who come here under those circumstances." Today, she said, "I'm happy to report that all of them are U.S. citizens. That just happened."

The mother has a job at Xpac, the oldest daughter is married and has two children, the next daughter has gotten a job at the new Amazon facility, "and the four youngest children are excelling at school."

It's anticipated that around 550 refugees will be resettled into the Quad Cities this year, among 85,000 to 90,000 people on track to come to the United States. Tapestry Farms is working with refugees currently from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Burundi, Uganda, Syria and Haiti.

McGlynn said the work that Tapestry Farms does focuses on a holistic approach to families. Each family comes in with situations requiring different services. Some people come to the United States with master's degrees; others have had no access to education.

"We meet with families and figure out a plan," she said. "Some families we're with for six months; some families have superintensive needs and we will probably be with them for years."

Tapestry Farms works with agencies to make sure that everyone has access to safe and affordable housing that "fits well with their life." The organization helps children get enrolled in school; facilitates school meetings with parents; helps them to find work; and makes sure they have access to food that's culturally specific.

"Many of our families prefer fresh produce, protein like chicken, goat meat and tilapia," she said.

The organization currently has eight urban farm plots, reclaiming underutilized local land to grow culturally specific fresh produce and flowers. One of the plots is at Palmer Hills Golf Course, where 300 cabbages were grown last year. The plots are maintained by refugees and volunteers. Last year, the plots yielded nearly 7,000 pounds of food, most of it, McGlynn said, distributed through local food pantries.

A government program allows Tapestry Farms to be paid market rate for what is distributed to the food pantries. McGlynn told the Rotarians about two recent developments with the organization.

A \$371,000 grant from the Deere Foundation has allowed

Tapestry Farms to purchase a 320-square-foot self-contained hydroponics unit, which can grow between two and six tons of produce annually. It is housed in the parking lot of the Quad City Botanical Center in Rock Island.

Tapestry Farms also is a participant in the Every Campus A Refuge program, in which St. Ambrose University is hosting a refugee family from Congo. The family lives

in a home near campus, and McGlynn said the campus community has fully embraced them, with students and staff volunteering their time with support services.

“I personally encourage each one of you, in any way that you can, to reach out to be of help to anyone,” she said.
