Mark Nook, UNI president

Mark A. Nook began serving as the 11th president of the University of Northern Iowa on February 1, 2017. Prior to this appointment, he served as chancellor of Montana State University Billings (MSUB).

Originally from Holstein, Iowa, Nook has committed his Midwest education and values to higher education for many years and on many levels. He is dedicated to ensuring every member of the university community reaches their individual educational, professional and personal life goals.

Prior to serving as the chancellor at MSUB from 2014-2016, Nook was the senior vice president for Academic and Student Affairs at the University of Wisconsin System from 2011-2014. He also served as provost (2007-09 and 2010-11) and interim chancellor (2009-10) at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point and in a variety of roles at St. Cloud State University in Minnesota.

He graduated from Southwest Minnesota State University in 1980 with a bachelor's degree in physics and mathematics, a master's degree in astrophysics from Iowa State University in 1983 and a Ph.D. in astronomy from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in 1990.

President Nook and his wife, Cheryl, reside in the UNI President's House. They

Rev. Rich Pokora introduced Bettendorf Mayor **Bob Gallagher**, but not until after **Tracy** told a story about working as a lifeguard with Bob years ago!

Bettendorf Mayor **Bob Gallagher's** message to North Scott Rotarians March 29: "We want to be financially sound and provide the best services." To achieve this, city leaders hold a three-day vision retreat annually. The results are laminated and placed on every person's desk.

One result: The city's bond rating was recently increased to AA+. "Our taxes are low in comparison with cities in Iowa over 10,000. We're eighth lowest," the mayor said. "We do more with less." The owner of an average house in Bettendorf (\$319,000) would pay 17 percent more if he/she lived in Davenport.

But there are challenges. An apparatus for a fire truck which cost \$650,000 a few years ago now costs \$2 million and city will have to wait two years to receive it. State legislators' rollback on assessments deprive the city of needed revenue. "There's \$3 million we are not collecting."

The city is building a pedestrian bridge and round-about to move traffic at TBK sports complex, at which \$120 million is being invested. "It's a great catalyst for the local economy." Two sewers are being extended under Interstate 80, and the mayor anticipates voluntary annexations.

Bettendorf has been adding 150 single-family homes annually, despite lots costing \$100,000, the mayor said. "It costs \$650,000 to build."

The city is also focusing on the "west end project," a park expansion west of the new I-74 bridge, as well as downtown improvements. "There are coffee shops and car washes everywhere."

Recently, Park Board membership was changed from elected to appointed.

Great things are happening, the mayor said. Last year, 40,000 rounds of golf were played at Palmer Hills, and Tapestry Farms is growing food there. Bettendorf and Davenport West students are welding bike racks. The city's library and museum are certified autistic centers and are "doing great." Splash landing will open in May. Citizens gave the city 90 percent approval in a Zencity Community Survey.

The meeting ended with members reciting Rotary's Four-Way Test.

Remembering our friend and fellow Rotarian, Warren Hodge, 83

Warren F. Hodge, 83, of Eldridge, passed away at Genesis Medical Center, East Campus in Davenport on Friday, March 29, 2024 surrounded by his loving family.

Memorial service will be held at 12:30 p.m., Friday, April 5, at Chambers Funeral Home in Eldridge. Visitation will be held from 11:30 a.m. until the time of the services on

Friday at the funeral home. Burial will follow at Rock Island National Cemetery.

Warren was born Nov. 3, 1940 in Oswego, New York, the son of LeRoy and Aleta (Miller) Hodge. He graduated from the University of Miami and later attended Babson College earning his MBA.

Warren proudly served his country in the Vietnam conflict and the Cold War, receiving many distinguished honors. He retired from the U.S. Army in 1991 after 28 years of active duty at the rank of Colonel. He continued working as a contractor for the U.S. Army at Rock Island Arsenal.

He is survived by his wife, Susan; his son, Warren Paul of Alabama; his daughter, Jennifer Day (David) of Ohio; his step-son, Christopher Myers (MaryBeth) of Davenport; his sister Carol, of Florida; four grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

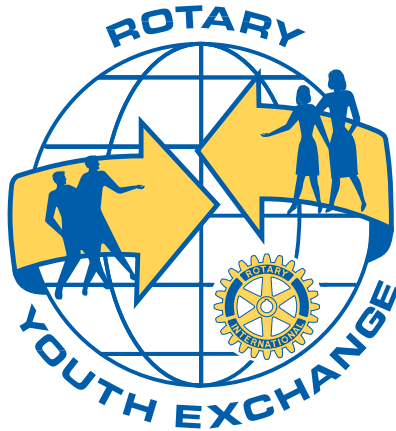
