Dress for Success: More than the name implies

Dress for Success Quad Cities is so much more than its name implies.

Executive Director Mauricio Diaz explained the mission of the organization – to help women achieve economic independence -- on Friday, April 26, to North Scott Rotarians.

Meeting that mission takes a number of forms, as he explained, “It’s much more than professional attire.”

Dress for Success Quad Cities was founded in 2011, part of a worldwide organization that began 15 years earlier. Through a network of volunteers and donors, it provides career counseling, job search assistance and professional networking opportunities – in addition to professional attire.

And, as Diaz noted, professional attire extends to many occupations. In addition to “office” attire, Dress for Success can provide scrubs, khaki pants, even steel-toed shoes for jobs that require them. Outfitting women for success also includes accessories such as jewelry, purses and belts, as well as new undergarments.

Diaz said in Iowa, almost 39 percent of single mothers live below the poverty level. On average, women in Iowa make \$14,000 a year less than men. In addition to assisting women with their clothing needs, Dress for Success also offers workshops on how to achieve financial

independence. Staff from University of Illinois Extension have led meetings on tips for grocery shopping. And a professional photographer is available to take headshots of clients to update their Linked In or Facebook profiles.

A Professional Women’s Group meets monthly at the Dress for Success facility at 423 E. 32nd St., Davenport, hosting a wide range of speakers on topics that help women to thrive in work and in life.

Diaz, whose background is in community and political campaign organizing, took his current position about two years ago. In 2023, Dress for Success served 193 percent more women than in the prior year. In 2024, the organization has already helped nearly half of all the women served in 2023.

He quoted one woman whom the organization assisted as saying, “The biggest thing that was so helpful is that I always had someone to go to and who I could talk to.”

Dress for Success career coaches assist clients “where they are,” he said, sometimes traveling to smaller communities in the Quad Cities when women are unable to get transportation to come to Davenport. Mothers can bring their children to workshops, and the organization provides dinners.

ROTARY PRINCIPLES

The Object of Rotary

- FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.
