North Scott Rotarian Becky Bray has seen many changes during her 45 years with Iowa State University Extension.

But what hasn't changed, she said in remarks on Friday, May 31, is the Extension Creed that says in part: "I believe in people and their hopes, their aspirations, in their right to make their own plans and arrive at their own decisions; in their ability to enlarge their lives and plan for the happiness of those they love."

Hired in 1978 to join the staff at the Scott County office of ISU Extension as 4-H and Youth Leader, Becky has over the years helped countless families and children and organizations improve their lives through Extension programming. She was named County Extension Director in 1995. She is retiring at the end of June.

She told her fellow Rotarians that she didn't have the easiest start, as she was the first woman to hold the job in Scott County. "I remember thinking, 'What is wrong with these people? This is 1978 ... of course women can do this work'."

The early days in her job found her spending weekends and evenings doing things like lock-ins at the Y, softball and basketball tournaments, project training and leadership activities.

"I took busloads of kids to Canada for an exchange, Des Moines, Wisconsin Dells and Washington D.C.," she said. "On those bus trips, even though I had done all the planning, our hosts would walk right past me to the older chaperones. I just looked too young. I wish I had appreciated that more at the time."

Other changes experienced included the farm crisis of the 1980s sending many rural women into the workplace, and since some people were forced off their farms, the enrollment in 4-H began to decline. Gender-based club names like the Davenport Plowboys had to be eliminated. (It became Davenport Farmers).

In addition to 4-H Clubs, she was also hired to work with all youth and serve new audiences.

"We had honor students working

alongside court-appointed kids and when they were working on a project, they were just all kids together," she said. "We also had a Youth Agenda group which worked with the City Council in Davenport to look at laws affecting youth. And when the Search Institute in Minnesota came out with their research on the Assets youth need to succeed, we were the first in the county to share it with the local schools and youth agencies."

Sharing the latest research and information is what Extension aims to do, she reiterated.

"We don't give out our opinions about things - we share research-based information - and try to provide what is needed in a timely manner."

Transitioning from typewriters to computers for fair results, having answering machines and email have all made the job more efficient.

"I do a bulk of my work using email and text and I get a lot more done!" she said.

Becky also touched on her 26-year membership in North Scott Rotary, (she was club president in 2011-12) which she said she found "helpful to Extension and warm to me personally. ... Rotary has been a support for me, and I will always be grateful for the friendships that have supported me in stressful times - most notably when my daughter had a brain tumor, and my husband had a kidney transplant. Thank you friends!"
