# School aid goal: Equal educational opportunity

NOTES, *continued*

### Program

**John Maxwell** introduced Mike Guanci and Emily Piper of the Iowa Association of School Boards, who presented "School Finance Basics":

There are 325 public school districts in Iowa, down from 455 in 1970. K-12 budget enrollment is 483,699 plus 23,360 statewide voluntary preschool enrollment, and nine Area Education Agencies.

Government entities involved in financing schools in Iowa include the Department of Education, Department of Management, Department of Revenue, the Iowa Legislature and Governor, the School Board Review Committee, and the federal government.

Iowa's School Aid Formula is designed to equalize educational opportunity, provide good education for all Iowa children, provide property tax relief, decrease the percentage of school costs paid by property tax, and provide reasonable control of school costs.

School districts have different funds that are separate and cannot be mixed: General Fund, Management Fund, Public Education & Recreation Levy, Student Activity Fund, Capital Project Fund, Physical Plant & Equipment Levy and Debt Service.

Funding for the School Aid Formula is driven by enrollment at the beginning of October. Statewide, there are 20,000 fewer students than 1996. The all-time high was 647,000 in 1971. Enrollment was trending up since 2010, until Covid.

Enrollment trends in this region, 2000 to 2023:

- Bettendorf, 4,343 to 3,952
- Davenport, 18,002 to 14,276
- Durant, 625 to 490
- Muscatine, 5,580 to 4,423
- North Scott, 2,935 to 3,028
- Pleasant Valley, 3,106 to 5,538

Statewide cost per pupil is \$7,635. This will increase in 2024-25 to \$7,826, but not all districts' total per pupil is the state cost per pupil. Variances are due to the origination of the school aid formula in the 1970s. While most districts' cost per pupil is \$7,826, some are higher, up to \$7,966. The Legislature has worked to close the gap between lowest and highest.

Iowa is the only state with a Spending Authority, i.e. a maximum allowed spending, above which any spending violates the law. - BT
