## Erwin King: Soles for Children

Friday, we'll hear from a man who saw a need and founded an organization to meet that need. Rotarian **Dr. William Hoover** raised awareness of Soles for Children for North Scott Rotary, and **Richard Horst** arranged this program.

**Erwin King** started Soles for Children, Inc. because he saw children going to school with holes in their shoes, which led to bullying. He wanted to help these children have better self-esteem and wanted to make sure that the children had new shoes, warm coats for the winter and haircuts for school.

In 2016, he began Soles for Children, Inc., by collecting 200 pairs of shoes with the help of two sponsors: Spans Pest Control from Eldridge, and Scotts Painting and Decorating from Rock Island. At the event, in which 300 pairs of shoes were distributed, he saw the smiles on the children's faces and realized that he needed to make this an annual event.

Over the past eight years, Erwin has worked diligently to provide children in need with not only shoes, but also coats, mittens, hats, and free haircuts. The event was so successful and reached so many children that two events were scheduled for several years – one at the Martin Luther King Center in Rock Island and one at the Friendly House in Davenport. In 2023, he served 750 children and plans to serve 1,000 in 2024. Due to both the need and success of the program, over 56 Quad Cities' businesses are work-

ing to support and donate funds, coats, shoes or provide other assistance to the program.

Even though he had serious health issues, Erwin continued to secure donations and sponsorships. He was diagnosed with a

rare disease that occurs in one out of two million people – Stiff Person Syndrome. It attacks all the muscles in the body and makes movement extremely difficult and painful. Seeing the smiles on the faces of the children, however, continued to motivate him to keep going and not give up. He filed and received a 501c3, which enabled him to file for grants to assist with funding for the Soles for Children, Inc. Annual Event. The 2023 event was very successful, reaching over 750 children and helping over 560 families, as well as feeding over 1,000 people. Additionally, 22 volunteers provided help with the event.

Erwin King was honored by Servpro and TV6 as the Hometown Hero for his service to children in the Quad Cities. Sarah Joehlin, who nominated King, said, "It was so obvious and so evident to me that he has a very kind heart and a very generous soul. He has risen out of his own adversity and did not look within himself; he looked outside himself. He saw a need for children and he provided for that need and to me that's what a Hometown Hero is all about. My hope in sharing Erwin's story is that someone out there would be able to provide him a brick and mortar that would come alongside Erwin and provide him office space and storage space for all of his goods, to provide him office space so that he can broaden his horizons."

Note: He is still looking for future sponsors and donations so no child goes without.

# Rotarians needed to mentor refugees!

Ukrainian refugees in Iowa. Thanks to **Jan Touney** for program notes.

Progress is ongoing in efforts to resettle Ukrainian refugees in Iowa, though the founder of the IA NICE organization said work continues to streamline the process, get more volunteers and find new ways to advocate for the families who have fled Ukraine as the war with Russia continues.

**Angela Boelens**, founder of IA NICE (Iowa Newcomer Integration & Exchange), updated North Scott Rotarians on the movement that began just months after Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022. This was the second visit to our club.

Boelens, a member of the Iowa Quad-Cities Rotary, showed numerous photos of Ukrainian families and individuals taken overseas in the midst of the fighting.

The slides in her presentation told the story:

“The lucky ones: Only injured.”

“Many: Lost forever.”

Among those who have helped IA NICE in sponsoring families are **John and Joan Maxwell**, Boelens said.

“They stepped up and helped a family of four that came into the United States,” she said. “That family is thriving.”

The Maxwells have since assisted with additional refugees.

The Ukrainians sponsored by the organization are classified as “humanitarian parolees” with no path to citizenship. Once here, they receive work authorizations and Social Security numbers. Children qualify for Medicaid, she said.

IA NICE enlists volunteers of experts such as community leaders, people in the faith communities, educators and health care providers to link the Ukrainians with necessary services and jobs. Family Integration Project plans are created for every family.

The organization has no paid staff, nor government funding. All help comes from volunteers, which currently number around 100.

She told North Scott Rotarians that experts in the following areas – salon and cleaning businesses, car detailing, construction/carpentry, accounting/finance and insurance – are needed to mentor the refugees in startup businesses.

“If you have an interest in getting involved, let me know,” she said. Information on volunteer opportunities is available on the group’s Facebook page, IA NICE.
