Dave Cook is a member of the Rotary Club of Boone. A Rotarian since 2001, Dave was president in 2008-09 and then served as Assistant District Governor for three years beginning in 2011. In 2012, he spearheaded the start of Club Visioning in District 6000, and during the next six years facilitated planning for dozens of clubs and District Action Teams.

Active in his community, Dave co-chaired Boone's Welcome Train team as part of his club's centennial. The restored train now sits just off Highway 30 to welcome visitors to Boone. Dave helped organize community referendums for a new middle school in 2004 and high school in 2011. Prior to his retirement in 2019, he also helped facilitate the establishment of 28 endowments benefiting nonprofits in central Iowa.

Lisa's passion for literacy stems from her 30 years as an educator. She's an author of three children's books, including *Martin MacGregor's Snowman and Peanut Butter and Homework Sandwiches*. Lisa's been an active member of Boone Evening Rotary since 2018. Her club shares her passion for literacy by giving Boone County children hundreds of books each year.

Dave and Lisa have two grown children, Hallie and Christian, as well as their dog Wrigley. Together, they hosted Rotary Youth Exchange students from Spain and Mexico.

Angela Reese conveys her passion about her job at ImpactLife in no uncertain terms.

"I love my work at the blood center," said the account manager for ImpactLife, where she has worked for 19 years. "I love to be able to do what I do."

And what she does, she told North Scott Rotarians on Aug. 16, is work with donors, volunteers and people who are the recipients of blood products. She sees firsthand the difference that blood donations make.

"Our mission is saving lives by providing blood products and services to communities in need," she said. "Every day, I have the hope of helping somebody."

Reese, the daughter of Scott and Nancy Case and a former North Scott Rotarian, gave a presentation with many interesting facts about ImpactLife's history, the need for blood products nationwide, and how important partnerships from businesses, schools, churches and community groups are.

"We have a lot of community partners who allow us to do what we do," she said.

ImpactLife, which began 50 years ago, has gone through many changes over the years. It began as a collaboration between the Rock Island and Scott County blood centers, which merged as the Mississippi Valley Regional Blood Center. Today, ImpactLife serves four states – Iowa, Illinois, Wisconsin and Missouri – with seven hubs and more than 20 donor centers.

"Despite our growth, we are still headquartered here in Davenport, Iowa," she said.

Independent community-based blood centers such as ImpactLife supply 60 percent of the nation's blood needs, while the American Red Cross supplies 40 percent.

An estimated 4.5 million Americans need blood transfusions each year, she said.

ImpactLife has helped supply blood products to many areas of the country when disaster strikes. Just recently, it sent several shipments to areas affected by Hurricane Debby.

Reese talked about the critical need for blood donors, as there is no alternative for blood products. She herself is a blood donor.

"The need is constant," she said, especially since blood has a shelf life. Platelets are good for 5 days, while red blood cells are good for 42 days. Plasma can be frozen for future use.

Reese noted that 38 percent of the population is eligible to donate blood, yet less than 10 percent does.

"There are a lot more reasons you can give blood than can't," she said. Information on how to become a donor or how to host a blood drive can be found at the ImpactLife website at www.bloodcenter.org.

Among those who cannot donate are people on blood thinners and cancer patients.

"People tend to self-defer," she said. "But more often than not, people can donate."

The North Scott community has been a great partner to ImpactLife, as the schools as well as businesses and other organizations host blood drives.

Any school that hosts a blood drive and brings in at least 20 donations receives a \$250 grant plus one dollar for each donation. In the past two years, that has brought \$4,000 to North Scott schools to fund scholarships, donations to other nonprofits, and school supplies.

"It takes a village for us to do what we do," she said.

In introducing his daughter, Scott Case proudly noted, "If there was one wish I could wish for everybody, it's that you have a son or a daughter that you are so proud of what they do and they have a passion for what they do, and that they really know they're doing something really well."
