As the state's banker and chief financial officer, Smith deposits and invest state funds, while also ensuring they are available when needed. He invests Iowa's pooled money, coordinates bonding and returns unclaimed property through the Great Iowa Treasure Hunt.

Additionally, he helps individuals with disabilities achieve a better life experience with the State's ABLE program and helps families save for future education expenses through Iowa's two 529 education savings programs, College Savings Iowa and the IAdvisor 529 Plan.

District 6000 District Governor Dave Cook laid out a road map for growth of North Scott Rotary as well as for clubs throughout the district in a wide-ranging presentation on Friday, Aug. 23.

Infusing discussion on particular goals for clubs during the 2024-25 year with the history of Rotary International, Cook, who attended the meeting with his wife, Lisa, referred back a number of times to this year's theme of "The Magic of Rotary."

"It's really about what we do together, arm in arm and hand in hand to make communities better places to live," he said.

He spoke of the many thousands of oak trees ("peace trees") that Rotary International founder Paul Harris planted around the world.

"Rotarians are part of a thousand forests that began as a small acorn when Paul Harris started the first club in 1905," he said. "From that small acorn grew 36,000 clubs in 220 countries."

Cook set out the challenge from Rotary International President Stephanie Urchick for all Rotarians: "We are not going to grow membership, end polio or bring peace to the world by waving a wand. It's up to you. You create the magic with every project completed, every dollar donated, and every new member inducted."

To that end, Cook presented four goals for clubs in the district, and gave specific numbers for North Scott Rotary.

GOAL 1: Achieve first net increase in District 6000 membership in over a decade. Cook said the average club lost two members last year. "At two times 65 (clubs), that's over 130 members," he said. He showed the 14th fastest growing clubs percentage-wise over the past 12 months. North Scott was not among them.

"But if I were to put up clubs that have grown the most in the past 5 years, North Scott would be No. 9," he said.

Over the past three years, North Scott has had membership totals of 100 (2022), 110 (2023) and 109 (2024).

"We appreciate what this board has done," he said, noting that the current board has set a membership goal of 116 for the coming year.

"What are we going to do to make it happen?" he asked. "We can do anything we set our minds to."

GOAL 2: Reduce 5-year average of newer members lost. North Scott has lost 48 percent of its newer members in the past five years, he said, compared to a district average of 34 percent. North Scott's goal is to reduce that percentage to 43 percent.

He said newer members leave Rotary not because they don't like what we stand for, but noted they are pulled in many directions by other organizations wanting their talents.

"The challenge is how do we engage newer members so they become long-term Rotarians in our club?" he said. "We believe some of these losses are preventable."

GOAL 3: Help start 4 new club extensions. A club "extension" is the addition of an alternate meeting date.

"Club extensions are a proven way to grow because there are some people who can't come to a noon meeting," he said, specifically citing educators.

GOAL 4: Generate new service project ideas based on interests of club members.

"We want to generate new service opportunities," he said. "Learn about the passions of your members. I want to encourage you to try something new this year."

Cook also spoke of an upcoming campaign to increase giving to The Rotary Foundation.

Returning to the acorn theme that began his presentation, Cook told of picking up acorns from the grounds of the Paul Harris home in Chicago. And then he asked North Scott Rotary President Greg Schaapveld to come to the podium.

Cook presented President Greg with one of those acorns in a commemorative box.

"My gift to you ... an acorn in a box," Cook said. "It represents all the good things this club can do while you're here."

POLIO: ROTARY'S NO. 1 GOAL

Dear Rotarian Polio Eradication Warriors,

Six new Wild Polio cases reported this week. We are now three weeks since the Onset of Paralysis of the most recent reported Wild Polio Case in Afghanistan.

Gaza (occupied Palestinian territory): Earlier this month, a 10-month-old unvaccinated child in Gaza contracted Polio and became paralyzed in one leg. The spread of polio, a highly infectious disease, poses life-threatening risks for children — especially as the majority of Gaza’s hospitals and health clinics have been destroyed or are only partially functioning.

Aug. 29: The Israeli military and Palestinian militant group Hamas have agreed to three separate, zoned three-day pauses in fighting in the Gaza Strip to allow for the vaccination of some 640,000 children against polio, a senior WHO official said on Thursday.

ROTARY PRINCIPLES

The Object of Rotary

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Rotary Code of Conduct

As a Rotarian, I will:

1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behavior and activities.
2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve Rotary.
3. Conduct all my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example for others.
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings.
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society.
6. Offer my vocational talent to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

The Four-Way Test (of the things we Think, Say or Do)

1. Is it the **TRUTH**?
2. Is it **FAIR** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **GOODWILL** and **BETTER FRIENDSHIPS**?
4. Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?
