LeAnn Auxier Josh the Baby Otter

LeAnn Auxier of the city of Urbandale's public swimming pool made a presentation on Josh the Baby Otter. This is an educational program sponsored by Rotary International and inspired by parents in Nebraska who lost a small child to drowning. A few statististics she sited was that drowning is the leading cause of death for children ages 1-4. It is the second leading cause of unintentional injury deaths in children 1-14. And, 58% of parents do not consider drowning a threat to their children.

Josh the Baby Otter is an in-school program for pre-school through first grade. It is preschool through f i r s t grade. It is pre-



sented in the classroom and incorporates coloring books, stickers, songs, etc. to reach the children. Last year our Rotary club supported this program, which locally reached 755 children. In addition, we gave money to provide swimming lessons for children who could not afford them.

At the end of the club meeting a check for \$1,000 was presented, to fund the program for a second year.
