Steve has two notecards on his desk, one of which says, "What am I going to do today to impact students' lives today?" and the other says, "What have I done today to impact student's lives?" After hearing his talk, it is clear that Steve is dedicated to the education and lives of the students in Urbandale.

This is a bond referendum of \$59 million to build two elementary schools, build an addition to Webster Elementary or Urbandale High School for future enrollment growth, and accelerate the timeline for building a new fitness center.
