Speaker

Bob Hartwig - Iowa Bankers Mortgage Corp

He is a graduate of ISU in AG Business, Law Degree from Drake. IBMC partners with community banks. It started in 1979 and is a bridge to the secondary loan market. It has grown from 12 to 89 employees and currently services 66,000 loans worth 9.7 billion, their 1% is 9.7 million dollars (depending on rates). They are in 12 states including: Iowa, Kansas, Colorado, Arizona and Nebraska. They are a wholesale lending corporation that services loans through Sallie and Freddy Mae and VA lending. Their purchasing is through a method of "correspondence lending" they have relationships with 225 local banks who do all the paperwork from application to approval on the initial loan prior to selling to IBMC.

COVID brought a huge jump in the market with 560 million in refinancing. 2023 saw a 30-year rate at 6%, so rates right now are holding steady. Many people have been holding off to see what the rates will do, so inventory and refinancing are low. Rates are set by the Capital Market. The FEDS goal is to control inflation and have full employment rates. IBMC does not compete with banks nor solicits customers directly. IBMC believes that their local personal relationships, service and attention are what is different about them and the services they provide their banks and customers. About 10 community banks a year are bought. Rocket Mortgage is the leading lender in Iowa. They are merging with Cooper Mortgage. After the merger, 1-6 loans will be serviced by them. Currently their loans are 75% in Iowa to 25% in other states, compared to 90/10 in previous years.

Iowa's Banking Insurance Services currently provides insurance for 22,000 employees and their families. They also provide mortgage services for these employees who have realized since 2010 mortgage refinancing is often an asset to these employees.


