## Jeff Hill The Jeff Hill Camp

Last Friday, we had two very special guest presentations.

First, we heard from Jeff Hill, regarding his summer basketball camp. The Jeff Hill Camp has been in operation for 36 years. This summer, they served 200 kids here in Des Moines. # **Chief Jerry Holt** Urbandale Fire Department



Our second, and Headline Speaker, was Jerry Holt, Chief of the Urbandale Fire Department.

Chief Holt came to Urbandale in February of 1998, and was the first full-time professional Chief of the Department. He came to Urbandale from southern Alabama, and originally expected only to be here about five years, but fell in love with the area and stayed. He still isn't used to how cold it gets in the winter.

From an all-volunteer operation when he arrived, the Urbandale Fire Department has grown to be a professional force of 34 full-time and 11 part-time members, working out of two stations, with 12 members on duty at a time. The goal is to be able to reach an emergency within 8 minutes of the call – important for both public safety and insurance rates! With the growth of the City of Urbandale to the northwest, the existing stations are simply too far away to meet this standard, so they have proposed construction of a third station. A bond issue for the funding is scheduled for the election, this November. In 2016, the Department answered 3520 calls, of which most -2496 – were for paramedic services. A medical emergency call gets both an ambulance and a fire truck, since so much equipment is needed to answer the call: basically, they have an Emergency Room on wheels. All members of the Department are cross-trained as both firefighters and EMTs, so they can provide whatever service is needed on an emergency call.

Chief Holt looks at the Fire Department as a customer service agency, and is intent on providing the best service possible. He shared stories of answering potential heart attack calls, where they had to wait for a spouse to get to the house and encourage the person in trouble to go to the hospital/doctor. In one case, they finished chopping up a fallen tree in the husband's yard; in the other, they finished packing up Christmas cookies for the wife's holiday deliveries. Public servants, indeed!
