The first step in addressing this was that Margie and the board began to identify the major hindrances to growth. They discovered two major issues: 1. Their club charged the second highest dues in their district, and 2. Many members couldn't make a weekly meeting.

The board went into action and was able to change the venue of their meeting and hire a cheaper caterer. The club enthusiastically

Mark McAndrews RYLA Camp Student

Brad Holland, Sky Holmes and Francie Nyinawumwami discussed their experience at the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) at Grinnell College, the week of July 16th-21st. Two hundred and 40 students from all over Iowa came together to practice leadership skills and learn about Rotary. The students were placed in teams comprising 12 students, a counselor (a highly recommended former RYLArian) and a Rotarian.

The week started with some introspective activities that delved into the individuals' unique personality and what approach they bring to problem solving. The Myers-Briggs personality assessment was presented by US District Court Judge Stephanie Rose. The "True Colors" personality assessment was completed on Monday morning. With these tools, they became acutely aware of how they operated in leadership positions, as well as how they were perceived in leadership positions.

supported reducing their dues from \$800 per person to \$380 annually.

The second issue was addressed in a most innovative way. They decided to livestream their meetings. They purchased the equipment for \$400. It was small and easy to install. The camera could fit in the palm of your hand and the microphone sits on top of the slide projector along with the laptop. Most people did not even notice the equipment. The result: Now every member is able to attend a meeting, even when they cannot be there physically.

What do we take away from this story from Stone Mountain? It is not a call to imitate their solutions indiscriminately. Rather, it is the need to assess our challenges to growth and to address them directly. This begins by listening to the prospective members who you are inviting to Rotary. Listen for the objections and let me or the Board members know. In the meantime, read in the Project Updates the list of how you can recruit and propose a New Member.

N u m e r o u s Team Time A c t i v i t i e s c h a l l e n g e d the students to work effectively as teams



to accomplish a goal. At the conclusion of each activity a counselor helped them explore the things that went well and the challenges they faced. It was constantly emphasized how those same challenges arise in all aspects of leadership, whether in school, sports, service organizations or many other aspects of daily life.

All three of our students exhibited enthusiasm for RYLA. Francine even commented it was the best week of her life since arriving in the US. Brad expressed interest in establishing an Interact Club at Dowling. Clearly, these students were affected by RYLA and will be better leaders and ambassadors for Rotary due to their experience at RYLA.
