Everybody has influence. The question is, does that influence include integrity? Often attempts are made at building influence on the strength of one's credentials, rather than one's integrity of character. John Maxwell, a foremost authority in developing leadership skills, contrasts the difference between influence which is built on credentials and influence built on character: "Credentials are transient, character is permanent. Credentials turn the focus to rights, character keeps the focus on responsibilities. Credentials look to the past accomplishments, character builds a legacy for the future. Credentials often evoke jealousy in others, character generates respect from others. Credentials can only get you in the door, character keeps you there!" (Maxell, Becoming a Person of Influence, p. 23) When you think about it, integrity of character raises the level of the Rotary 4-Way Test from "IT" in each question to "I"... Am I truthful?, etc. In this way, as Rotarians, we have the greatest potential for doing the most good in the world and making a lasting difference! So . . . what are you doing with your "saucer" this week?
