Gunnar Olson - Water Trails

Our Speaker, Gunnar Olson, substituted for Todd Ashby, who is recovering from surgery.

Historically, and especially during the westward movement, towns were established along waterways for purposes of transportation. As new modes of transportation have developed, we have become disengaged from our waterways. The Greater Des Moines Water Trails Project is a coalition of local organizations that seeks to develop and improve the waterways in the Des Moines area. Goals are to promote safety (remember the drowning and near-drowning at the Center Street Dam?), foster economic development, attract tourism and workforces, improve water quality, and provide additional opportunities for outdoor recreation. This will have a regional impact, with 150 rivers and creeks in the area and 86 projects on the drawing board.

Because of the reliable flow of water, the Center Street Dam location in Des Moines is targeted to become a "High Energy Adventure" with a white water feature, a wave generator, the nearby Lauridsen Skate Park, a viewing deck, and possibly even ZIP lines

over the river. The Scott Avenue Dam and bridge is the most



popular fishing location in the State, according to the DNR. Fleur Drive leading to Gray's Lake is targeted to relocate the low-head dam and create a learn-and-play area, similar to Center Street, without the white water features.

Just a few examples of other locations with plans in the works: Raccoon River & Blue Heron Lake in WDM, Beaver Creek in Johnston, near the Merle Hay exit from I-35/80, Colby Park in Windsor Heights, Prospect Park on the DM River near Birdland, Walker-Johnston Park in Urbandale

Plans are designed to improve access with trails, beaches, docks, boat rentals, shelters and picnic areas, etc.
