Wolves affiliated with the Minnesota Timberwolves in the 2017-2018 season. Consistency in branding by the organization has grown the fan base to almost 100,000, which is 2nd in the G League.

The Wolves are proud of their social responsibility within the community. For example they have holiday shopping for underprivileged kids at Scheels, a Metro League for 400 players to develop their skills (no coaches), Hoops for Troops, Community Celebrities where game jerseys are auctioned off to benefit non-profits. Our game with them on February 23rd is predicted to be a sellout game with a predicted 7,000-9,000 in attendance. This will allow us to meet our goals for money towards polio from at game donations.

Ed Arnold then gave some follow-up information about the specifics of this game and the impact it makes on polio eradication. There are 14 clubs that participate in any one year, 18 overall over the years. There is an "Arnold" trophy that has been awarded to the club that sells the most tickets. Our club won the first year, West Polk has won for 7 years and West DSM won last year. 289 tickets were sold by our club last year. This year will be our 15th game. Overall we have: sold 14,980 tickets, have net \$150,000, with the Gates' Foundation match \$450,000. We have been able to immunized over 750,000 children and have spurred the power of volunteers such as Pakistan which has 250,000 and Afghanistan 30,000. He directed us to the global initiative on the district website for the latest data on current global cases.
