Blake Rozendaal - Urbandale Public Arts

Our speaker on January 6th was Blake Rozendaal, a member of the Urbandale Public Art Committee. The Committee was created in 2008 to enhance the appearance of the City of Urbandale through the integration of art in the public environment. Blake noted that "art" comes in many representations, including the following themes: Community, Culture, Education, Family, History and Vision. The Committee is a subgroup of the Parks and Recreation Commission and therefore makes any recommendations to members of that commission.

The various pieces of art that adorn and highlight the uniqueness of the City can be viewed in a number of locations. For example, pieces are on display at the Urbandale Public Library Art Gallery and City Hall and rotate every 2-3 months. There are also pieces at the Urbandale Art Park, there is "Splash Art" located in various parts of the city on sidewalks, bridges (yes, a shark's mouth is painted on one underpass) and even electrical boxes.

The sources of these pieces are far and wide, highlighting individuals from both the local area as well as further afield. For example - to highlight the "History" and "Culture" themes, at the Urbandale Fire Department there is "9-11 Memorial Steel", given to the department by the New York Port Authority. "Across Currents", a sculpture by Bouunak Thammovang, can be found on the Walter Johnson Park Trail and is a metaphor for people of different backgrounds at their first meeting. For more detailed information on the location of all of the pieces and background on both the art and the artist, please visit the City of Urbandale's website.

Looking ahead, the Committee will be focusing on the performing arts, increasing the amount of Splash Art and considering the idea of holding an arts festival. Blake promised to keep us updated as the year progresses.
