Rotary is at the forefront of increasing the awareness of the focus on mental health by creating a sense of belonging and placing particular importance on acts of kindness through service. As I have noted, Rotary did exactly that for me 10 years ago when I had returned to the US after two decades away and was searching for connection and service.

The high school students I am working with through Avenue Scholars had an entire week devoted to becoming aware of mental health items. Coincidentally, I just received an email from the chair of my fraternity's Chapter Advisory Board which stresses the importance of holding discussions on the topic and provides resources to help facilitate discussions. It's refreshing to see this emphasis on young adults, in these cases ages 16 to around 22. Things have indeed progressed quite far since I was that age!

On the more extreme end of the spectrum of mental health, I just finished a book called The Best Minds that delves into the life of Michael Laudor. The author, a New York times reporter named Jonathan Rosen, does a remarkable job weaving in the history of the diseases, the entire gamut of treatments, associated stigmas while detailing his friendship with Laudor from adolescence through Yale Law school and beyond.

On a personal note, near the end of the book, Rosen delves into a potential movie based on Laudor's life (with Ron Howard the director), generated by interest in a lengthy NYT piece back in 1998. In another example of how small the world is, the screenwriter was the brother of a friend of mine from my days in Croatia. If you read the book, you'll discover why the movie wasn't made, with one of the reasons being Howard's interest in Slyia Nasar's book - A Beautiful Mind.

After several years of operation this organization he merged with another local nonprofit called Courage League Sports. play in the traditional sense. This has been done through adaptive solutions and personal individual support to the player.

As a result of COVID, a few years ago, Opportunity on Deck and Courage League Sports merged their missions. The new mission is to bring adapted and no cost recreational programs to the community by removing barriers to play.

Can Play's Opportunity programs strive to serve our communities by providing no-cost athletic and youth development opportunities for our participants. Our goals are to teach valuable athletic skills and techniques, provide positive role models, instill life-long values, and promote diverse communities amongst youth. Our programs are typically 8-week sessions. All sessions cover the cost of the equipment to play, transportation to and from practice and games, jerseys/costumes, and meal after practice.

Can Play provides adapted recreational sports and skills programs suitable for all ages and abilities. These programs are designed to meet the unique requirements of individuals with disabilities, including physical, cognitive, emotional, developmental, and neurodiverse conditions (autism), as well as those utilizing wheelchairs or walkers. Can Play's programs modify pace, equipment, and structure to establish a secure, positive, and accessible environment. Participants will enhance their social engagement skills and improve their confidence by enjoying activities with teammates and coaches.

Their programs are scheduled all over the metro area. Some programs take place at the RecPlex in West Des Moines. They are always looking for people with a passion to help people play through providing a location to play, volunteers, or donations. These are truly two local organizations founded in Iowa doing good work in Iowa to assist Iowans live fuller lives.
