Finally, we would head out to Winchester, VA to serve an Opening NIght barbeque at Camp Fantastic, a camp for kids with cancer. The onset of August, when it all had ended, was a bit of a let-down as I missed all the planning, service, and interaction with members of other local clubs.

I mention these activities as I feel that a similar time for our club is fast approaching. First there's district orientation this weekend, which brings together members from many other clubs for discussions about DGE Dave Cook's plans for FY25. I believe that I indicated during Steve Wieneke's talk about RLI a few months ago that, for me, the fellowship and reconnection at these events ranks with the content. Then we have the district foundation socials, the Wolves game on the 23rd of February, planning for pickleball and the tourney, the District Celebration in Pella and the raffle at HyVee.

Plenty of upcoming activities offering opportunities to serve, reconnect and once again highlight the power of Rotary. And no need for concerns about the weather!
