# Andrew Batt - Iowa PBS



Andrew Batt, Executive Director of Iowa PBS addressed the club and gave us an overview of Iowa PBS's history and vision for the future. While he has only been the executive director for a couple of weeks, he has 2 decades of service to Iowa PBS and is well versed in its history and mission.

Iowa PBS was founded in 1969 and originally broadcast from a studio at Tech High School. From those humble beginnings, the mission has been constant to serve and expose Iowa. From those early days Iowa PBS has expanded to serve Iowa through multiple over the air channels as well as many streaming services (Hulu, YouTube, PBS Apps). Iowa PBS now serves nearly 2 million users every month through 9 transmitters, 8 translators and various streaming services.
