As we've been highlighting, one of District Governor Dennis' areas of focus this year is to support an agency that helps the homeless. We've had Joe Stevens from Joppa visit our club twice, once during a presentation by Amber Lewis from the City of Des Moines. We've also directed our clothing donations to Joppa. This week I'll provide some background on the work Joppa does each week. Volunteers are critical for this work; it's easy to sign up and go on a route. Here's how it works:

Joppa has routes each Sunday (and on Saturdays from December through the end of March to provide heat). When I write "each Sunday", this means something close to the past 700 consecutive Sundays! Upon arrival at Euclid around noon, you'll see teams loading color-coded carts for each of the 10 routes. Carts are pre-arranged outside the center so all that is required is to pull up and load. The contents are what you expect – hot and cold meals, produce, bakery, canned goods, medical items, sundry food items and "mail". "Mail" consists of specific requests from clients from previous weeks and are generally batteries, blankets, and shoes.

Everyone – usually around 30 people – gathers inside for last minute instructions: approach camps in teams, be respectful, spend a bit of time talking; cars begin leaving before 1 pm. Teams are 3-5 people, depending on the route. I was on the green route this past Sunday and we had 9 stops and saw over 50 individuals. Gloves were distributed, mail was delivered, and additional requests were taken. Each team has an iPad to log those served, note requests and other route changes.

I had the iPad this week which allowed for more time for conversation, including with one person had only recently become homeless. I told her about the resource center, and she's set to meet Joppa on Tuesday to find assistance and, hopefully, permanent shelter. We arrived back at the center around 4:30, where we were met with yet another team that unloaded for us, allowing for a quick departure. As I indicated when I introduced Joe at a recent meeting, everything is thoughtfully and efficiently organized, and goes beyond the provision of material aid.
