Leslie Irlbeck Metro Waste Authority

Friday March 19th Speaker was Leslie Irlbeck of Metro Waste Authority.

They are a 28e Government Entity, so are a not-for-profit, that is owned by 23 local communities. They were formed to do safe and smart ways to get rid of waste. They are a manager, not a hauler of waste.

They own and operate 6 facilities throughout the Des Moines metro area: East and West Landfills – Metro Central Transfer Station – Metro NW Transfer Station – Compost Center – Hazardous Waste Drop-off Center

In November of 2021 they will officially open a new recycling center in part of their Grimes facility.

MWA is involved with community initiatives to help with achieving no wasted resources. They help with natural disasters, working with Polk County Emergency Services.

Covid-19 created challenges but it helped them start a new curbside pickup program.

MWA is also a leader in conservation efforts, mainly water quality and wetlands construction. Education is a key way to changing behavior. They do this in 3 ways: Classrooms where they have a former teacher go around to schools, an on-site Environmental Learning Center on the East Landfill and through professional development.

Landfills have a life cycle that is multiple decades of years. They follow a financial formula required by law. They are regulatorily required to manage a waste site for 30 years after it is closed for use. The current site has many decades left of use, as they are only actively using 500 of the 2,000 acres.

A motto MWA goes by is to take an active stance to put ourselves out of business.
